

LENT: What's the Big Deal?

We tend to think of Lent as a time of preparation for Easter – which it is, But Lent has its own unique character. In the first four centuries of Christianity, it was normal to have baptism on the night before Easter (the Vigil). Lent was the time for final "catechesis" or instruction preparing candidates for baptism. By the early Middle Ages, it was rare for anyone to enter Christianity as an adult convert. Lent then became a time of repentance for people who had been excommunicated and wished to repent and be forgiven in time to commune at Easter. At the beginning of the season, they put on sackcloth and ashes, which is the origin of Ash Wednesday.

The time of repentance and spiritual renewal was eventually extended to all Christians. It is forty days long to parallel Jesus' forty days of fasting and prayer in the wilderness after his baptism (Matthew 4:2). It also reminds us soberly of the forty-day flood and Israel's forty years in the wilderness.

Although Sundays are always celebrations of Easter, and so not properly part of Lent, we tend to observe Lenten customs on Sundays because our people may not get much Lent otherwise. We omit the "Gloria in Excelsis" and "Alleluia" and have no flowers at the altar so Easter will seem more joyful when they return. Violet, the color used during Lent, is penitential, but also reminds us of the mocking royal robe placed on Jesus by the soldiers (Mark 15:17).

So, how can I respond? You can make use of Lent as a time of spiritual renewal by committing yourself to more intensive bible reading and prayer. Fasting can help you focus on eternal nourishment. Likewise, charitable giving can help break your attachment to this world and benefit your neighbor. (See Matthew 6).
