

Community Success Adriana and Elizabeth's Story

Ice cream was without a doubt, the favorite treat of Adriana and Elizabeth Angulo during their childhood and the sisters carried their love of ice cream into adulthood. Tasty ice cream moments and family memories associated with them inspired them to start their own traditional ice cream shop with a Mexican twist that not only allowed them to share their culture and brought them closer as a family, but also gave them something to pass onto their children. Adriana and Elizabeth grew up in Guadalajara, Jalisco in Mexico with their parents and two other siblings. Their mother was a resourceful entrepreneur who made delicious homemade ice cream with natural ingredients and



sold it along with fruit, snacks, and candy outside their home. "I was little and I remember seeing my mother heading to the local market for produce. She would bring out a table in front of the house, while I played and skated. I remember watching her, how she would sell her products out there. And it sticks in your head, that inspiration to work hard no matter what or to take that opportunity" explained Adriana. The idea to start their own ice cream shop came to Adriana after she worked 11 years for a company and realized that that wasn't really where she belonged. Not only did their mother inspire their ice cream shop, but she also connected Adriana to Mi Casa Resource Center[®]. The sisters took a business class at Mi Casa a few years ago and then took the virtual Business Success[®] Manage class fall 2020. Adriana learned about marketing, finances, taxes, how to differentiate their business, good leadership skills, and she had the opportunity to learn from guest speakers. Now Adriana and Elizabeth are their own bosses and have the opportunity to make more time for their families. Their kids are proud of them and they're learning about entrepreneurship. "I think there's a lot of valuable things about Mi Casa for people who want to start a small business. It's hard to pick just one thing, but more than anything they make you feel like you're not alone on this journey," reflected Adriana
