Philosophy and Goals

At King of Glory, we value children for who they are, not for what they know or what they can do. We demonstrate this by listening to them, recognizing their efforts, and providing opportunities for each child to feel successful.

At King of Glory, we provide a climate in which children can explore their world at their own pace. Through "handson" activity centers, and experiences, children are encouraged to discover answers, properties, relationships, skills, and concepts for themselves.

- We strive to build a "language rich" environment to ensure that young children gain the verbal skills necessary to communicate feelings, thoughts, and needs. We promote creative adventure with language by exposing our students to the best of early childhood literature and encouraging their own imaginative use of language.
- We foster the development of strong, healthy bodies by providing nutritious snacks, promoting good health habits, and designing our playground and classroom areas to stimulate both fine and gross motor development.

At King of Glory, we are dedicated to nurturing in each child the knowledge that she/he is special to God, created, loved, and uniquely gifted by Him.

Curriculum Program

Our program is carefully planned to help each child build a creative and healthy self-image, to develop empathy for others, and to develop critical thinking skills necessary for everyday living. Although our schedule is dictated by the needs and interests of our students, a typical day will include a wide variety of learning experiences including:

- Group Activities (storytelling, finger plays, etc).
- Independent learning tasks (blocks, manipulative, etc).
- Science exploration (observation and discussion of natural forces in earth, sky, weather, life, pets, etc).
- Art experiences (easel painting, crayons, collage, finger painting, chalk, etc).
- Dramatic play (a chance to try on different life skills, occupations, relationships, etc).
- Music and Movement (songs, rhythms, rhymes a chance to experience music experimentally and creatively).
- Sensorimotor training (body image, space and direction, balance, visual discrimination, large a small muscle activities).
- Chapel times and other spiritual growth times (opportunities to share prayers, songs, stories, and God's love).
- Snack times Nutritious snacks are provided mid-morning and after the children's nap in the afternoon. We are a **Nut-Free** School.
- Outdoor Play Our outside environment has been carefully designed to promote both large and small muscle development.

Chapel

We worship together regularly in the church sanctuary. This is a special time to meet with the children and tell stories, sing songs, and tell the children about God's love for them. This time is carefully planned to be age appropriate for preschool children. Chapel is offered on alternating Thursdays and Fridays.

We will use Brightwheel for communication, billing, and signing your children in & out daily. Once you accept your Brightwheel invitation, you will receive your child's four-digit code.

You will need to use the four-digit code at drop off and pick up each day.

Look at just SOME of the things a child learns through Play...

In the <u>LANGUAGE & LITERACY</u> center, the child:

Learns to recognize and identify the letters of the alphabet and their sounds

Learns respect and care for books

Formulates and evaluates predictions

Health

The State of California Department of Health requires a health clearance from your child's doctor verifying that the child is physically and emotionally able to participate in a preschool program. This health screen must also certify that the child is up to date on all necessary immunizations and has had a recent TB test.

Should a child become ill at school, she/he will be isolated, and a parent contacted. If we cannot reach a parent, we will call those persons listed on the child's emergency card. Parents or other authorized persons are expected to act quickly if they are requested to pick up an ill child at school. Until an authorized person arrives to take the child home, we will monitor the child's condition. If a temperature reaches 103, we will contact the child's physician. If she/he is not available, we must call the paramedics.

If your child experiences vomiting, diarrhea, or fever, they must be symptom-free for at least 24 hours before being allowed to return to school. If you are in doubt as to whether your child is ill, please, keep him/her home. Some symptoms to watch for include, but are not limited to:

- Fever
- Runny Nose
- Cold
- Rash
- Diarrhea
- Sore Throat
- · Watery/inflamed eyes
- Respiratory illness
- Draining sores/burns
- Vomiting
- *Please notify the school immediately if your child contracts a communicable disease*

Medication

A <u>Medical Authorization Form</u> must be completed prior to any medication being dispensed at school. Only medications prescribed by a physician may be given by our staff. Such medication must be in the original container, with full instructions on the label. Over the counter medication must also be prescribed by a physician, in writing.

Accident Or Injury

Minor injuries will receive first aid treatment by a staff member. If a more serious injury is sustained by a student, we will make an immediate attempt to contact a parent. If we cannot reach a parent, we will call the child's physician. If necessary, we will call the paramedics. Until the arrival of a parent, physician, or paramedic. The director or person in charge will make all decisions regarding the care of the child. Parents will be expected to assume responsibility for any resultant expense. School insurance will contribute to the cost of expenses after the student's personal insurance has been applied.

Disaster Procedures

In the event of a disaster, no student will be released to anyone other than a parent or legal guardian, without written instructions from the parent requesting that the child be released with another adult. Students will remain with their teacher and class until released to a parent or guardian. In accordance with state regulations, we review and practice emergency procedures with students each month.
