4 USC 9: Conduct during hoisting, lowering or passing of flag (Text contains those laws in effect on November 29, 2024)

#### §9. Conduct during hoisting, lowering or passing of flag

During the ceremony of hoisting or lowering the flag or when the flag is passing in a parade or in review, all persons present in uniform should render the military salute. Members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute. All other person's present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, or if applicable, remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Citizens of other countries present should stand at attention. All such conduct toward the flag in a moving column should be rendered at the moment the flag passes.


## Honoring Gold Star Spouses Day: A Salute to Enduring Strength



This is new as of 1 August 2024. Our Service Office, Eddy Baker, is still getting information about this change and he will ensure that the post is briefed.

National Headquarters is currently rewriting the duties of the Service Office and that will tell us more.

I'd like to share with you the words of Pastor Martin Niemöller, a German imprisoned for seven years for opposing the Hitler regime.

First they came for the socialists, and I did not speak out –

because I was not a socialist.

Then they came for the trade unionists, and I did not speak out –

because I was not a trade unionist.

Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out –

because I was not a Jew.

Then they came for me – and there was no one left to speak for me.

His words are food for thought during tough times. We should never be afraid to state our position or beliefs, it's healthy. Remember our Veterans creed: "Maintain My Physical and Mental Discipline."

<u>Today's quote</u>: "We will either find a way or make one."
