The Circuit Rider The Pastor's Pondering Rev. J. Paul Bruhn

Many years ago, before our children were born, Marion and I had been invited to attend a football game in Dallas, Texas. No, it was not "the Cowboys," we attended the first football game of SMU after their ban was lifted. SMU played the "Arkansas Razorbacks," and we won. Great excitement until we reached the parking lot. It turned out that we had parked our trusty Ford Taurus right in the center of a sea of Razorback vehicles. So, we did what every self-respecting Pony would do, took off our caps, kept our heads down and prayed that no one would see the tiny little SMU parking sticker until we had reached the highway.

St. Paul writes to the Christian community in Rome, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel (of Jesus Christ,) because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile (Romans 1:16, NIV.) Paul boldly declares, "I am not ashamed," and that most definitely held true for his life and ministry 2000 years ago. Reading his letters and the story of the early Church in the "Acts of the Apostles" we cannot help but wonder, where he got the courage to stand so boldly for the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the midst of adversity.

Today many of us seem to be as courageous for Christ as Marion and I were as "Ponies" in the midst of "Razorbacks." We are challenged for our convictions all the time, and the easiest way out seems to be keeping a low profile and praying that the pressure will go away.

However, there is a great difference between our allegiance to a football team and our conviction that Jesus Christ is the Savior and Lord, the Son of the living GOD. The difference is twofold. First – and I know some of you will disagree – football does not carry any eternal consequence. Second, the good news of Jesus of Nazareth being the Messiah for all humankind is not a human invention, but the divine answer for the need of humanity to be reunited and at peace with its creator. While there are many different football teams there is only one Name by which man must be saved (Acts 4: 12, John 14: 6.) Furthermore, when we testify to GOD's love we are not left to our own devices. GOD promises to give us HIS power and the guidance of His Holy Spirit as we testify to our contemporaries (Acts 1: 4-8.)

During the season of Advent, with wreath of evergreen, candy canes and mistletoes people tend to be more open for the good news of Jesus Christ. Let us determine to become more courageous – like St. Paul – and be prepared to share with those around us that Jesus was not just a cute little baby, but the Son of GOD who died at the cross of Calvary so that we may live eternally. Invite your friends and neighbors to join us for our Advent worship services, the caroling, the "Jingle Bell Bash" and our Christmas Eve Candlelight service. Why? Because Jesus did not only die for our sins, but GOD raised Him from the dead. Christ is alive, seated at the right hand of GOD – preparing to come back in glory – and trust me you don't want to miss that pep-rally.

This Christmas give the gift that truly makes a difference – CHRIST Himself!
