

The Pastor's Pondering Rev. J. Paul Bruhn

The irony is not lost on me. I am currently sitting at home dealing with a runny nose, cough, and just feeling very much under the weather.



This is – at least currently – not matching our experience, neither in corporate worship nor individually. But even Jesus encountered problems. We read in the Gospel of Mark, chapter 6:5–6 (NKJV) "Now He [Jesus] could do no mighty work there, except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them. And He marveled because of their unbelief. Then He went about the villages in a circuit, teaching."

It would have been easy for Jesus to blame the circumstances. Instead, He pushed in and moved forward by equipping the original 12 with the calling to proclaim that the Kingdom of GOD was at hand. They were given authority over unclean spirits and healed many by anointing them with oil (Mark 6:13, NKJV)

Healing and deliverance have been part of the Kingdom of GOD from the very beginning. It is actually Matthew who makes the connection from the Old Testament to the New Testament. He writes in Matthew 8:16–17 (NKJV) "When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: "He Himself took our infirmities And bore our sicknesses."

If you are the owner of a reference Bible that connects different Scripture passages, I would invite you to spend some extra time and follow those leads. You might even come up with some connections that the editors of your Bible edition have not explored. What an amazing adventure.

The above connection is found in Isaiah 53. Before we go there, I want to draw your attention to Psalm 103:3 (even though, I believe one should read Psalm 103:1-5 for context). Healing comes from GOD. Sickness is not part of

GOD' original plan but an expression of the fallenness of creation after sin entered the human experience. Another Psalm passage would be Psalm 107:20, NASB 1995, "He sent His word and healed them, and delivered them from their destructions." Who is 'His word'? The standard Sunday School answer is correct, "JESUS". We read in John 1:1–4 (NKJV), "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men."

In Jesus we have healing for all our brokenness in spirit, soul, and body (1 Thessalonians 5:23, NKJV).

The Prophet Isaiah introduces believers to the concept of the 'suffering servant', an individual that is sent by GOD to restore the original relationship between every human and their Creator GOD. This servant is accomplishing this task by taking on our punishment so we can stand before GOD sinless, receiving all the blessings he has for us. Isaiah vividly describes that servant in Isaiah 53:3–6 (NKJV), "He is despised and rejected [forsaken] by men, A Man of sorrows [pains] and acquainted with grief [sickness]. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. Surely He has borne our griefs [sicknesses] and carried our sorrows [pains]; Yet we esteemed [reckoned] Him stricken, Smitten [struck down] by God, and afflicted. But He was wounded [pierced through] for our transgressions, He was bruised [crushed] for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes [blows that cut in] we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, everyone, to his own way; And the Lord has laid on Him [has caused to land on Him] the iniquity of us all."

In this rich passage we need to familiarize ourselves with a unique feature of the Hebrew language. The same Hebrew term can often have several meanings. For that reason, I have included in the above reading the alternative wording. This makes clear that GOD covers ALL our short comings, unintentional sin as well as intentional iniquities. GOD has caused our punishment to land upon Yeshua (= YaHWeH saves, heals, and delivers) so we are free of shame and condemnation.

Hondo Methodist Church News From Lay Leader Tricia Boll

It has been almost two years (2/27/2023) since our church disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church. One of the conflicts between the UMC churches wanting to leave the denomination was that UMC had (has) a trust clause for their member churches, stating that 'all properties of UM local churches are held, in *trust*, for the benefit of the entire denomination, and ownership and usage of church property is subject to the *Discipline*.' Very fortunately, the UMC, for a limited period of time in 2023, released the properties of disaffiliating churches from that rule. Hondo Methodist Church is a non-profit corporation recognized by the State of Texas and is the sole owner of its properties, but the names on the titles have not been changed, and must be by April 13, 2025. In December, 2023, the Corporate Board of Directors voted to form a holding company to protect our properties from any other denomination who might choose to have a trust clause for its member churches in the future. The Global Methodist Church does not have a trust clause, but most denominations in the United States do. Hondo Methodist Church Holdings, Inc. is now a non-profit corporation recognized by the State of Texas. On March 16 after the Worship Service, we will have a Church Conference where the members of the congregation will vote on either:

- 1. To transfer our church properties to Hondo Methodist Church Holdings, Inc. or
- 2. Not to transfer church properties to HMCH, Inc.

The benefit of our properties being held by a holding company is to keep control of our properties locally and to protect our church from liability. It is important that HMC members are informed and will have the opportunity to vote their preference in March by attending the Church Conference.

A two-thirds majority vote is required to go forward with transferring church titles to HMCH, Inc.


