The Pastor's Pondering Rev. J. Paul Bruhn

Not too long ago I mentioned an old hymn entitled, "Bringing in the Sheaves," (Our Great Redeemer's Praise, #464) and I shared my conviction that many

of our younger contemporaries do not understand the concept of 'sheaves' since they never witnessed the old harvesting style with a sickle and then tying the grain together in sheaves to move them easily onto a wagon that would bring them to a threshing floor.

Yes, it is harvesting time, and many things have changed. Combines speed up the process powerful light fixtures basically allow for harvesting 24/7, and even the proverbial 'cotton picking' is now automated and instead of sacks of cotton you have large bails that look like the ends of a giant's Q-Tip. We no longer receive our wages in cash, but by check – old timey, or by electronic funds transfer. While all this might be safer and more convenient, we are losing the moment of satisfaction when we receive the fruit of our labor.

Yes, we do focus on stewardship in the month of November. It is a thoughtful reminder to keep the giver of every good and perfect gift at the forefront of our minds. There are firstfruits, tithe, gift, and offering, and they all are meant to teach us the attitude of gratitude as we make giving to GOD our highest priority. With all these gifts a simple truth is reliable, "Give to GOD what is right and not what is left.

Giving of our time, our talents, as well as of our finances all fall under stewardship. Giving to GOD goes as far back as to Cain and Abel. Chapter 4 of Genesis describes how Cain gave "... some of the fruits ..." as an offering, while Abel "... brought fat portions from some of the firstborn of his flock ...", a.k.a. firstfruits. In response the LORD accepted Abel's offering, but Cain's fell flat.

While the tithe can be traced back to Abram and Melchizedek (Genesis 14:18-20), which precedes the giving of the Law, GOD's Word makes clear that giving to GOD from what we first have received from Him, is considered a proper act of worship. In full disclosure, nobody ever bothered to tell me about worshipping GOD with my financial means while I was growing up in Germany. Money was not an issue that was discussed around the proverbial kitchen table, and the larger Christian denominations relied on a tax system that was based on a certain percentage of everyone's income. With no instruction I was not even aware what blessings GOD has in store for those who honor Him with their income.

It was in my second year in seminary that I truly started looking into the concept of tithing, gifts, and offerings, as well as

firstfruits. Tithing is easy, since it simply means 10%. I have encountered people who asked me if the tithe was to be taken from the gross or the net income. My tongue in cheek answer has always been the question if they would like a gross or a net blessing. Everybody wanted a gross blessing.

There are moments where GOD might direct us to give sacrificially to a particular cause in the Kingdom of GOD, e.g. providing a scholarship for a Global Methodist student at the West Africa Theological Seminary (WATS). Maybe we want to show our gratitude to GOD by giving a special offering out of thanksgiving, because He might have protected us from a bad accident. So, I understood, tithe, gifts, and offerings, yet I still struggled with 'firstfruits.' When do you give it? How much do you give? And – maybe most importantly – why do you give it?

Firstfruits are discussed in Deuteronomy 26. It is a thanksgiving offering from the first fruits that have been harvested, acknowledging GOD's lordship and that He is ultimately the provider for all our sustenance. The Israelites are encouraged to recount how GOD provided for them and their ancestors first in the wilderness and then in the promised land.

Needless to say, I blew it back in Germany. My very first paycheck would have been my firstfruits. Instead of honoring GOD I spent it on a beautiful tobacco pipe that I had had my eyes on for several months earlier.

Now I knew what firstfruits were, but I still did not know how much the appropriate amount would be. Reading some rabbinic sources, there is no set amount for firstfruits, since the LORD did not want to stifle the generosity of the giver. Free to give how much your heart desires!

May GOD's Spirit guide and direct you in this season, as you prepare to be a joyful giver and faithful steward to the glory of GOD.


