To keep our volunteer leaders energized and meet the changing needs of our young people, we update our program regularly.

We believe Scouting should be accessible to everyone. That's why we offer a bursary scheme to ensure that money issues do not exclude any member from our activities.

This impact report shows the significant influence our Scout Group has on its members and the broader community. It highlights the positive changes our group brings to young people's lives and helps build trust with parents, carers, and the community.

By sharing this report, we hope to attract new members and volunteers. It shows what the 1st/16th Sutton Scout Group is about and its positive impact. It also demonstrates our group's value to the community.

This year has seen a significant change to the way that the Group is managing finances.

Following a Trustee meeting it was agreed to formulate a protocol to move the Group to the use of pre-paid debit cards and make proficient use of OSM (Online Scout Manager). As a result, enhanced control measures were introduced to enable the Group and Trustees carry out their legal responsibility of a duty of prudence and make sure that the Groups money is protected, appropriately used, and accounted for in a timely manner.

The Group introduced pre-paid cards to Beavers, Cubs and Scouts that allows the Group to have a tight control on the financial strength of the Group without having to wait for each section to provide a reconciled balance of monies held and a transfer of membership monies to the Group account. Goods and services are purchased at the point of sale, online, or over the telephone. All transactions made using the card are recorded electronically and monitored.

A considerable transformation was needed in the way the Group, Beavers, Cubs and Scouts implemented financial management. September saw the start of this transition, with full implementation being achieved early 2024.

The major impact on the Group financial position is that subscriptions and activities are now paid directly to the Group account and are accounted for on a real time basis. Section accounts have a contingency limit only. This directly replaces the need for Sections to produce individual accounts that then have to be reconciled and verified that can be time consuming.

accounting protocols will immediately benefit the Group.


