This mentions Fletcher just getting out of the hospital so that must be why Berkley was running it. Probably was working there learning the business from Fletcher. **I must have only worked** there for 3-4 weeks because I remember going on the trip visiting Joy and Allen Boules. We also continued on to East Machias ME. and visited the Mason family, former pastor at Atwell Hill Church who was pastor of a church there. When I worked at Fletchers I lived with my Grandparents and walked back and forth about 1/2 to 3/4 mi. It was further going back because it was uphill. Go East across the flat to what was Florence Ramsdell's house then down a small hill, across another flat and down another hill. It was on the left if you were going east, north side of the road. The chicken house is still there, sits back against the woods. **People name of McCormick own my grandparents place now.**]

Della was up part of the time & had a little broth & toast for dinner, don't look good. Mabel & Preston are good. I cut off two of her begonias. We started home at 5. Got off road a little once getting onto 128 & it was foggy but got home in 4 1/2 hrs., at 9:30. Had lunch & went to bed. Tom & Edna stayed here."

•Alton G. Deblois, seaman apprentice, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Melvin Deblois, is serving aboard the attack carrier USS Franklin D. Roosevelt operating with the Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean. The Roosevelt is scheduled to visit several Mediterranean countries during the seven-month cruise and conduct training exercises to maintain its high level of readiness and efficiency.

[USS Franklin D. Roosevelt (CVB/CVA/CV-42) was the second of three [Midway-class aircraft carriers](#). To her crew, she was known as "Swanky Franky," "Foo-De-Roo," or "Rosie," with the last nickname probably the most popular. Roosevelt spent most of her active deployed career operating in the [Mediterranean Sea](#) as part of the [United States Sixth Fleet](#). The ship was decommissioned in 1977 and was scrapped shortly afterward. She was the first aircraft carrier of the United States Navy to be named in honor of a president of the United States. After post-refit trials, Roosevelt sailed for her new homeport of [Mayport, Florida](#). In February 1957, Franklin D. Roosevelt conducted cold weather tests of catapults, aircraft, and the [Regulus guided missile](#), in the [Gulf of Maine](#).^[1] In July, she sailed for the first of three consecutive [Sixth Fleet](#) deployments.
