Another Orfordville boy of the Long Ago, entered into rest in Manchester, N. H., on January 23 after a serious illness of only two weeks in the hospital. His sister was with him during most of this time, coming from Wisconsin.

Charles had lived in Manchester for more than 36 years and had hosts of friends there. He was 70 years of age. His last work was many years of faithful service for the Boston & Maine Railroad.

He was the only son and youngest child of E. Bayley and Amanda (Page) Strong, the only remaining grandson of Eben and Myra (Bayley) Strong. Five generations of the family have lived in Orfordville since its earliest settlement. The eldest sister, Dr. Mary Strong of many years of devoted service in Omaha, Nebr., passed away in 1916. The younger sister, Emily Wheeler Strong of Milwaukee and Orfordville was with him at the last and with Willard Harris, friend and neighbor of many years came home with him on Tuesday, the 26th.

The service in Manchester was Monday evening and was attended by the cousins of Manchester and New London, and many friends, Rev. James English of the Hanover Street Congregational Church officiating.

Rev. Owen Washburn offered the committal prayer in the Old Church Yard on Dame Hill where so many of Orford's people of the early years attended Sunday services and are now at rest.
