# Basic Parts to Identify

Before you start stitching, it helps to get familiar with the key parts of your sewing machine. Think of this as your machine's "hello, nice to meet you" moment!

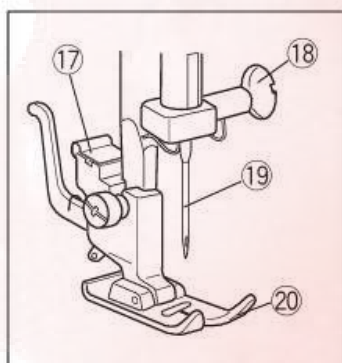
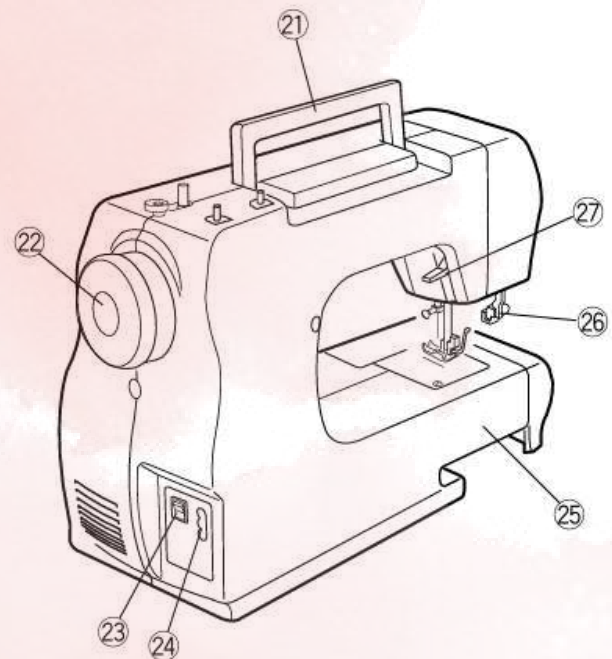
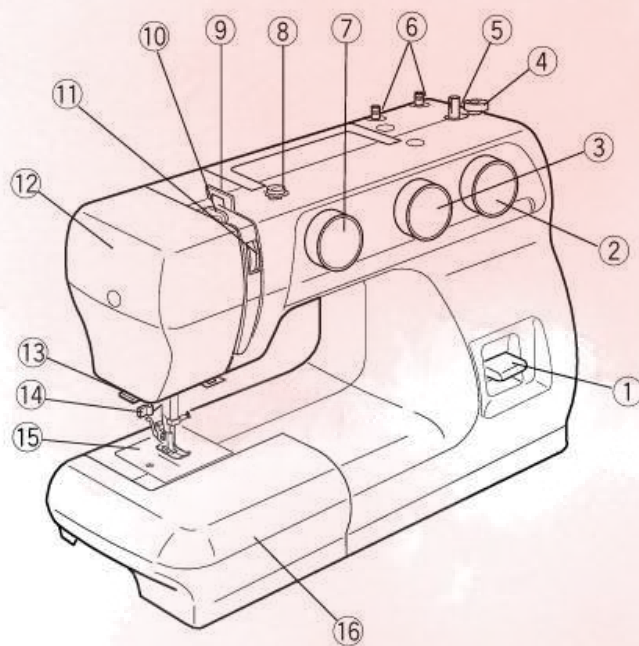
Understanding what each part does will make it easier to thread your machine, troubleshoot problems, and feel more confident while you sew. Don't worry—you don't need to memorize everything right away. This section is here to help you get comfortable and build a solid foundation.

Your sewing machine manual is one of your best tools! It includes a diagram like the one below that labels all the parts specific to your machine model. Keep it nearby while you learn—matching the parts in your manual to the ones on your machine will help everything click much faster.

# **Inserting the Needle**

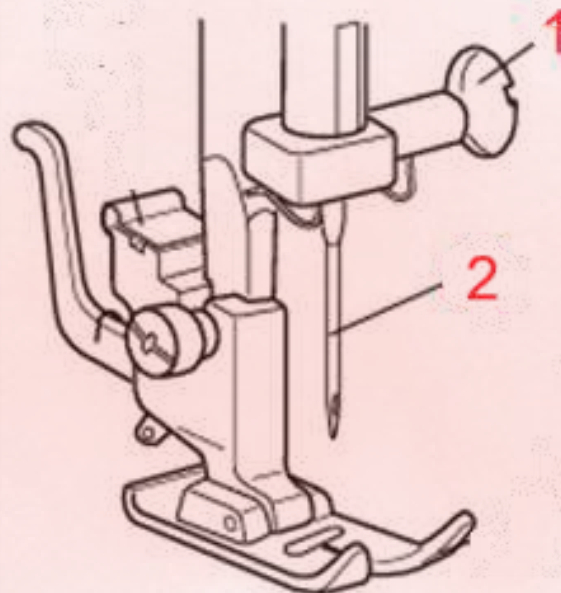
Whether you're replacing a dull needle or switching types for a new fabric, inserting your sewing machine needle correctly is key to smooth, safe stitching. Always turn off your machine first, raise the needle to its highest position, and insert the new needle with the flat side facing the correct direction (usually toward the back). Make sure it's pushed all the way up before tightening the screw securely.

Replace your needle around every 8–10 hours of sewing or at the start of each new project to avoid skipped stitches and fabric damage.

### How to Set Up Your Sewing Machine for First-Time Use

- Raise the needle to its highest position using the handwheel.
- Loosen the needle clamp screw ( '1' shown in the image below use a small screwdriver or your fingers, depending on your machine).
- Insert the new needle ('2' shown in the image below ) with the flat side facing the correct direction (usually toward the back—but check your manual!)
- Push the needle up as far as it will go into the needle bar.
- Tighten the needle clamp screw securely.
- Double check that the needle is inserted straight and firmly.



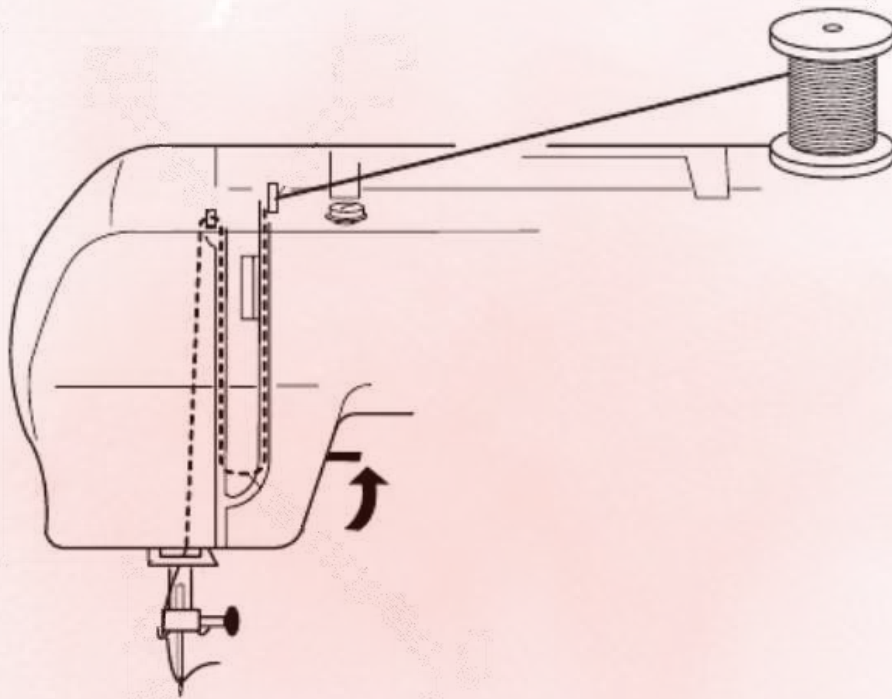
# Threading the Machine

Threading your sewing machine might seem tricky at first, but once you've done it a few times, it becomes second nature! Always start with your presser foot up and follow the numbered threading path on your machine, making sure the thread catches in each tension guide. Most home sewing machines thread the needle from front to back unless your machine manual says otherwise. Always re-thread both the top thread and bobbin if you're having stitch problems—it solves more issues than you'd expect!

 **Pro Tip:** Use a dark-colored thread when you're learning—it's easier to see against your machine and spot if anything goes off track.

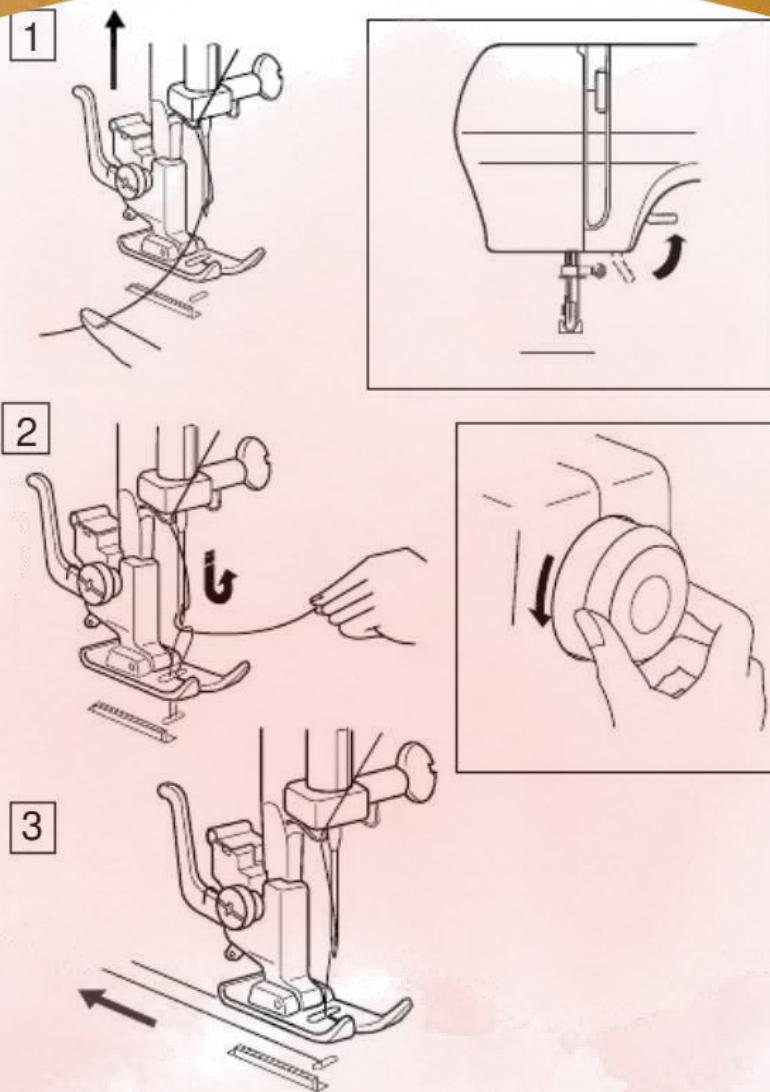


- ☐ **Place the thread on the spool pin**
- ☐ **Follow the thread path (usually numbered arrows on machine)**
- ☐ **Thread the tension discs**
- ☐ **Pull thread down, then back up through the take-up lever**
- ☐ **Thread the needle (front to back or left to right depending on model)**

# Winding and Inserting the Bobbin

Before you can start sewing, you'll need to wind thread onto the bobbin and insert it correctly into your machine. Most machines have a bobbin winder on top—just follow the guide arrows, snap the bobbin into place, and let it wind evenly (top to bottom of bobbin). Once it's full, insert it into the bobbin case (drop-in or front-load, depending on your machine) and pull the thread through the proper slot. Always wind your bobbin at an even speed to prevent loose or uneven tension during stitching.

**Best Practice:** Use the same thread on your bobbin and top spool to avoid tension mismatches and ensure smooth, balanced stitches.



- Place thread on spool pin and bobbin on winder
- Wind bobbin and stop when full
- Insert bobbin into bobbin case  
(flat side up or down depending on machine)
- Pull thread through bobbin tension guide
- Holding the top thread as you turn the handwheel  
"catching" the bobbin thread and pulling bobbin  
thread up through the needle plate

# Setting Up to Sew

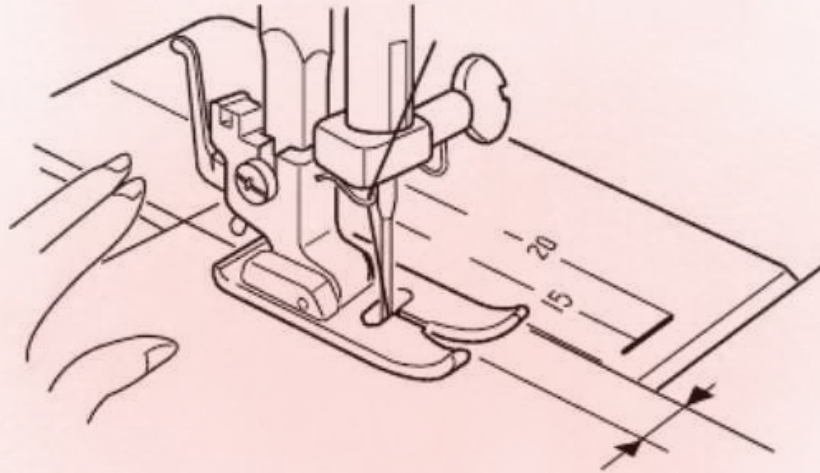
Once your machine is threaded and your bobbin is in place, it's time to set up for sewing! Choose your stitch, adjust the stitch length and width if needed, and line up your fabric under the presser foot. Remember to lower the presser foot before you start stitching—that's what engages the tension properly.

 **Pro Tip:** Always do a test stitch on a scrap piece of fabric to check your tension and stitch settings before starting your actual project.

## **Setting Up to Sew**



- ☐ **Ensure your needle is in the upper most position**
- ☐ **Align fabric edge with seam guide on throat plate**
- ☐ **Turn hand wheel toward you to lower needle into fabric in your starting position**
- ☐ **Lower presser foot before sewing**
- ☐ **Select a straight stitch (default setting for beginners)**
- ☐ **Adjust stitch length to 2.5mm (standard)**
- ☐ **Use scrap fabric to test tension and stitch settings**

# Sewing Basics

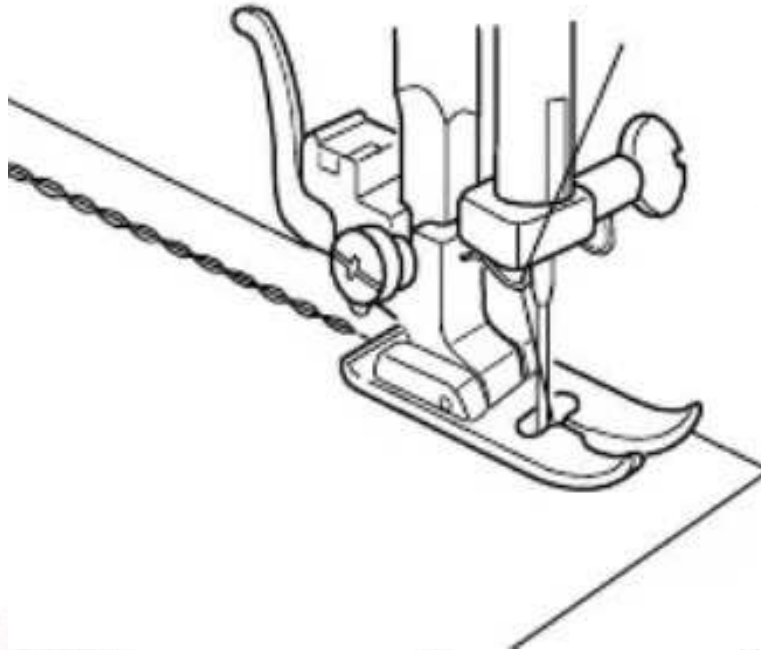
Now that your machine is set up, it's time to start stitching! Begin by gently guiding your fabric while the machine feeds it—let the machine do the work without pulling or pushing. Practice sewing straight lines and turning corners slowly to build control and confidence. Don't worry if your first stitches aren't perfect—learning takes practice!

Start each sewing session with a few test stitches on scrap fabric to make sure your tension, stitch type, and thread are all set up correctly.

 **Pro Tip:** Keep your eyes on the seam guide lines, not the needle, to stay straight and consistent.

## **Sewing Basics**



- **Hold thread tails when starting to avoid thread bunching or (bird nesting) under the fabric**
- **Gently press the foot pedal to control speed**
- **Use the handwheel to stop with the needle in the down position (for pivoting)**
- **Practice straight lines, turns, and curves on scrap fabric**

# Beginning and Ending a Stitch Line

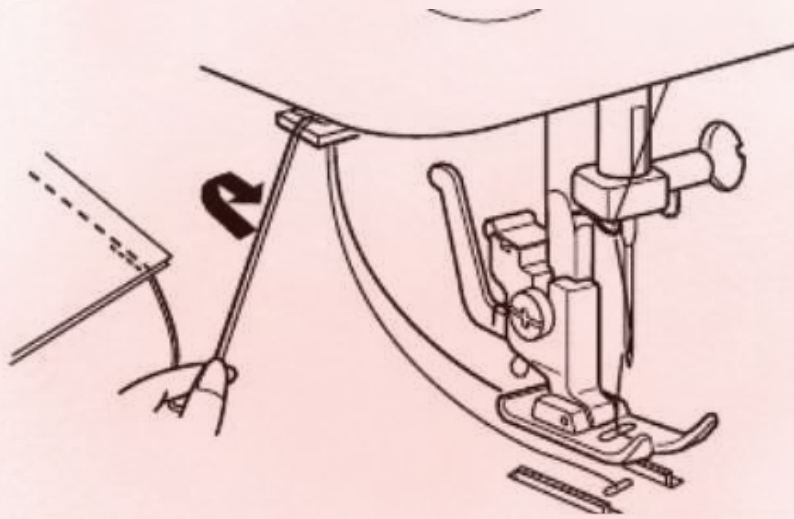
When you begin or end your stitch line, it's important to secure your stitches so they don't unravel. You can do this by using the reverse stitch button to backstitch a few stitches, or by tying off the threads manually for a cleaner finish. Then, raise the needle and presser foot, gently pull the fabric away, and trim the threads.

Use backstitching only when appropriate—avoid it on topstitching or delicate fabrics where it might show or cause puckering.

 **Pro Tip:** Always leave a 2–3" thread tail after trimming—this helps prevent your machine from unthreading at the start of your next seam.

## **Beginning and Ending a Stitch Line**



- ☐ **Use reverse lever/button to backstitch at beginning and end**
- ☐ **Raise needle and presser foot**
- ☐ **Gently pull fabric away and cut threads with thread cutter or scissors**
