In the Company of Trees is one of the most popular events during the year. It is always close to Arbor Day and Earth Day. We make a circle of lawn chairs and blankets under these sloping arms of the ancient live oak tree in Mennello Park. Our friend Virginia apply named her, "The Forest of One." We sit in the fresh air, talk, and ponder the beauty of Mother Nature around us, then venture out on our own meditative walk in the beautiful park.



Labyrinths have been in existence for hundreds of years. They are a means of stepping out of daily life to release, reflect, meditate, and find illumination. The Labyrinth at Woodlawn is thirteen circuits and is like the one on the floor of the Cathedral in Chartres, France. It represents many things to different people. The four quadrants can reflect the four stages of life, among other things. We notice as we walk with others that, as in life, we can walk next to someone for a time and then they are a distance away, or they may walk with us for the entire time. We may notice how we encounter others. Do we pass them, or do they pass us? Do we walk slowly or quickly? We may shed our cares on the way in, and even find answers on the way out. Even though the paint on the Woodlawn Labyrinth is fading from the Florida sun, it is still a beautiful form of walking meditation.
