The City Commission of the City of Cordova, Alabama, met in regular session at 6:30 o'clock, P.M., on January 5, 1988, at the City Hall. Upon roll call the following members were present:

Benny Manasco, Commissioner

Absent: None.

The Mayor declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.

The Mayor acknowledged and welcomed the visitors present, and was introduced to Senator Bishop by Representative Ed Frazier.

The City Clerk read the minutes of the last regular meeting of December 15, 1987. Commissioner Drummond made a motion to approve the minutes, as read. Mayor Richardson seconded the motion. Upon being put to a vote, the following voted for the motion: Commissioner Manasco, Commissioner Drummond and Mayor Richardson. Nays: None. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

Mayor Richardson made a motion that Ordinance No. 103-88, "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE AND DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF CORDOVA AND ITS POLICE JURISDICTION", be adopted and approved. Commissioner Drummond seconded the motion. Upon being put to a vote, the following voted for the motion: Mayor Richardson and Commissioner Drummond. Nays: ^{None} Commissioner Manasco ~~ABSTAINED~~. Mayor Richardson declared the motion carried. A copy of the ordinance shall be posted in the U.S. Post Office Building and one copy on the bulletin board in the City Hall for a period of five days, at which time the Ordinance becomes law in the City of Cordova, Alabama.

A discussion was held in regard to a problem at the sewer plant. Mayor Richardson stated that engineers had been hired to check the sewer plant to determine the problem. A valve has been twisted off, and the cost of temporary repair will be \$ 1,800.00. Commissioner Manasco made a motion to have the sewer plant repaired. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Drummond. Upon being put to a vote, the following voted for the motion: Commissioner Drummond, Commissioner Manasco and Mayor Richardson. Nays: None. Mayor Richardson declared the motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Drummond to transfer \$ 6,000.00, from the Garbage Fund to the General Fund, for the purpose of reimbursing the General Fund for the December payroll of Sanitation employees. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Manasco. Upon being put to a vote, the following voted for the motion: Commissioner Manasco, Commissioner Drummond and Mayor Richardson. Nays: None. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

The Mayor declared a quorum present and called the meeting to order.

The City Commission discussed Ordinance No. 104-85, "An Ordinance Regulating the manufacture, sale and discharge of fireworks within the City of Cordova and its police jurisdiction."

Commissioner Drummond made a motion to rescind Ordinance No. 104-85. Mayor Richardson seconded the motion. Upon being put to a vote, the following voted for the motion: Commissioner Drummond and Mayor Richardson. Commissioner Manasco abstained. The Mayor declared the motion carried.

The Mayor then read the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 102-87

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE AND
DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF CORDOVA
AND ITS POLICE JURISDICTION

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONS OF THE CITY OF CORDOVA, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

In accordance with the provisions of State Code of Alabama 1975, 11-44-7, 11-44-17 and 11-44-18, the City Commission of the City of Cordova hereby adopts the following:

Article 17 of the Southern Standard Fire Prevention Code 1974 Edition, Adopted by reference "ORDINANCE TO ADOPT STANDARD CODES" adopted August 5, 1975, is hereby amended as follows:

Article 17.03 (b.) Except as hereinafter provided, it shall be lawful for any person to possess, store, to offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail, or use or explode Class C fireworks; provided that the Fire Chief shall have power to adopt reasonable rules and regulations for the granting of permits for supervised public displays of fireworks by a jurisdiction, fair associations, amusement parks, other organizations or for the use of fireworks by artisans in pursuit of their trade. Every such use or display shall be handled by a competent operator approved by the Fire Department, and shall be of such character and so located, discharged or fired so as not to be hazardous to property or endanger any person.

It shall be unlawful to sell fireworks of any type or kind to person under eighteen (18) years of age.

ADOPTED by the City Commission of the City of Cordova, Alabama, this 21st day of December, 1987.

Mayor Richardson made a motion to adopt the Resolution. Commissioner Drummond seconded the motion. Upon being put to a vote the following voted for the motion: Mayor Richardson and Commissioner Drummond. Commissioner Manasco abstained. The Mayor declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, upon motion made and seconded, the meeting was duly adjourned.
