

Cordova, Alabama August 13, 1985 10:00 o'clock, a.m.

The City Commission of the City of Cordova, Alabama, met in regular session at 10:00 o'clock, a.m., August 13, 1985, at the City Hall. Upon roll call the following members were present:

Absent: None.

The Mayor declared a quorum present and the meeting open for the transaction of business.

Mayor Stone welcomed the visitors to the meeting.

Twila D. Pastore and Vince Mazzara met with the City Commission to discuss matter of trash collection and removal at the Warrior River Apartments. Ms Pastore read a letter addressed to Mayor Stone, as follows:

Dear Sir:

I know you are aware of the problem with trash collection and removal at th Warrior River property. None of the ideas from our previous discussions hav proven effective in our attempts to gain resident support and cooperation. some of our previous methods worked for a short time, nothing we have tried really solved the problem.

I feel the only option available to us now is for the City to contract Dixi Waste Disposal to pick up the garbage there. Dixie Waste can provide the dumpster containers that should prove more effective in our collection effor Of course, Warrior River Apartments would continue to pay the established collection rate to the city for this service.

I have contacted Dixie Waste for their current prices. Each container with four (4) cubic yard capacity costs \$50.10 per month. Currently, it would to 3 containers of that size to service Warrior River Apartments.

This solution could prove more cost effective to the City of Cordova, while better serve the citizens of Warrior River Apartments. I will appreciate the council's consideration and approval in this matter.

The City Clerk then read the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 103-85

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE PUBLIC DISPLAY, CONSUMPTION AND POSSESSION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES WITHIN THE CITY OF CORDOVA AND ITS POLICE JURISDICTION.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Commission of the City of Cordova, Alabama, as follows:

SECTION I CONSUMPTION OR POSSESSION IN PUBLIC PLACES, GENERALLY

It shall be unlawful for any person to dirnk or have in open or uncopossession for drinking any liquor or wine at or in any public place be unlawful for any person to drink or have in open or unconcealed custody for drinking, any malt or brewed beverage at or in any public purposes of this section, the words "public place" shall mean and in automobile or other motor vehicle while on the public streets or other place. The words "public place" shall also include all parking area ways, breezeways, sidewalks and other areas in any apartment complex which is an area of general use to tenants in common and as such are domain of public view.

State law reference - Public Intoxication, Code of Alabama 1975 X13A-11-10

SECTION II. SAME - AT PLACE OF PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT.

Without limiting the generality of the provisions of Section I, it shall be for any person to drink or have in open or unconcealed possession or custodliquor, wine, malt or brewed beverage at any public gathering for any athletic event, theater, picture show or other place of public entertainment.

Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00). In addition thereto, any person so convicted may be imprisoned or setnenced to hard labor for the City for a period not exceeding six (6) months, at the discretion of the Court trying the case; provided, however, no penalty shall consist of a fine or sentence of imprisonment exceeding the maximum fine or sentence of imprisonment established under State law for the commission of substantially similar offenses.
