What is a Hope Spot?

- SCIENCE ADVISORY Mission Blue, in partnership with the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN) maintains a scientific council headed by Dr. Earle that reviews Hope Spot applications from communities around the world and approves those that meet specific scientific and conservation criteria.
- EXPEDITIONS Mission Blue has launched more than a dozen expeditions around the world to explore Hope Spots highlighting research, conservation and educational efforts. Our team influences policymakers and creates compelling documentaries that educate and inspire the public.

- COMMUNICATIONS Mission Blue is a leading global ocean conservation brand that has a million followers online and uses its power to elevate Hope Spots and create public pressure for their official protection.

- Single Use Plastic




Florida Keys checks all the boxes!

What qualifies as a Hope Spot?

- A special abundance or diversity of species, unusual or representative species, habitats or ecosystems
- Particular populations of rare, threatened or endemic species
- A site with potential to reverse damage from negative human impacts
- The presence of natural processes such as major migration corridors or spawning grounds
- Significant historical, cultural or spiritual values
- Particular economic importance to the community

The idea is that anyone can nominate a site special to him or her—a site that gives HOPE.



What are our goals?

- To build a knowledge base and exchange from which to build on, delivered by GIS/outreach programs, local events, knowledge sharing, comradery and inclusion. Make better data driven decisions that apply locally.
- To engage the next generation to be part of a conservation effort. To make all around improvement in engagement.
- To support local conservation efforts and gather information relevant specifically to the Florida Keys.
- To create the cohesive factor for government agencies, NGO's, and facilitate community-lead development of sustainable practices.
- To develop a reproducible and scalable conservation model available for all NGO's in many other locations in coastal regions.
- To share our efforts and results with our network members and locally.

The World Federation for Coral Reef Conservation fosters stewardship of the Florida Keys' marine ecosystem by engaging private, public and governmental entities as well as promoting advocacy and supporting Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary's programs and partnerships as well as the <u>United Nations Sustainable Goal 14</u> which we were among the first organizations to make voluntary commitments for action items.
