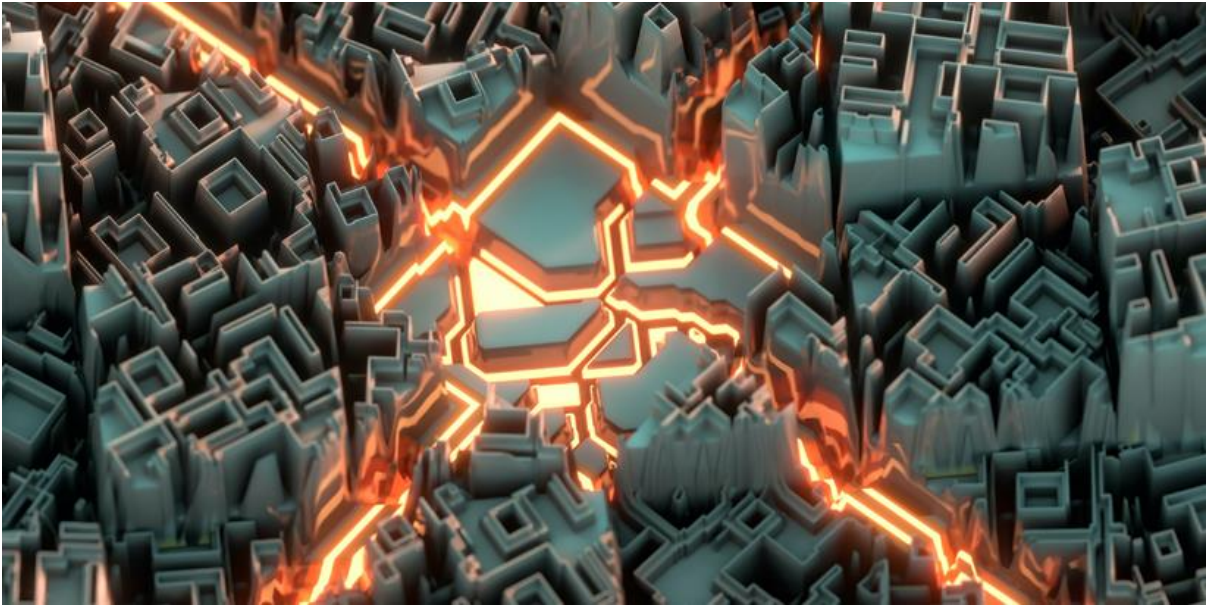


Royal Photographic Society - AI and Photography



The Royal Photographic Society is hosting a hybrid conference on 9 and 10 October 2023 looking at many aspects of AI as it affects photography - good and bad.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) has been part of photographic production for several years but the easy availability of generative AI has prompted concerns about AI's impact on photography, as well as an interest in new ways of creating images in equal measure, notwithstanding ethical and legal issues.

With this two-day conference the RPS presents a series of eighteen international speakers - all specialists, academics or creatives - and four keynote presentations that will discuss the impact and opportunities of AI for photography, as well technical, legal and philosophical issues.

The conference is arranged in **four panels**: Introductory; History, Theory Application; Legal, Rights Practice; and Creative Practice over two days. Each panel will be followed by a Q+A with the speakers. It is presented in a hybrid format: live in RPS House, Bristol, and Livestreamed.
