Minutes of AHFAP AGM 2nd November 2023

1. Minutes for 2021

2. Chairs Report

After 5 years as Chair of AHFAP Kira Zumkley has decided to step down from the role. Kira took the time to talk about the positive changes that have been made to AHFAP in the past year, thanking the committee for their work and praising this year's conference. She then introduced each of our two candidates Jason Candlin and Isidora Bojovic. The candidates then had the opportunity to present to the members.

3. Election of Chair

Below is a brief outline from each of our candidates.

Jason Candlin has worked as a photographer in the cultural heritage sector for almost 10 years, having previously had a long career as a medical photographer, during which time he served as a committee member of the Institute of Medical Illustrators, culminating in being IMI Chair in 2013-2015.

For the past three years Jason has serves on the AHFAP committee as part of the Events Team. As chair, Jason will draw upon his experience in previous roles and his recent time on the committee and he'd like to use the early stages of his tenure to stabilise and build a strong footing to work from. To do this he is planning to establish a firm timeline of the AHFAP year, with milestones of what is happening and when. With these markers the committee would be able to focus on delivering the changes required to continue the modernisation of AHFAP.

There has been a lot of change in the background to how AHFAP operates, and it now has a very modern feel in its day-to-day running. Jason will reflect on these changes outwardly to present AHFAP as a modern, diverse organisation representing all that work in the sector. On the back of that work, he'd like to firm up the AHFAP's position as the leading body for professionals working in the industry. He'd like to reach out to those institutions and individuals that aren't engaged and

invite them into the vibrant association they possibly aren't aware of by raising our profile. Jason will focus on mixing the traditional with the new, to continue ongoing growth and deliver a fast, modern, diverse association with firm foundations that reflect its history and its future in the modern world.

Isidora Bojovic is an active AHFAP member contributing with conference presentations, hosting workshops and offering portfolio reviews. She has worked with both commercial and heritage institutions for almost 20 years, specialising in still life/object photography and architecture. Currently she is employed as a Lead Photographer at the Science Museum Group where she is managing a team of staff photographers and oversees all London studio activities. She has also worked as a Print lead on Steve McQueen's "Year 3" project at Tate Britain, leading on colour management, junior photographers' training, retouch and print execution and collection metadata audit. Subsequently, she joined Tate Photo Studio as freelance photographer, where she continued to photograph collection objects and gallery spaces across Tate Modern, Tate Britain and Art Stores. Other institutions she worked with include the Sharjah Museum Authority including Museum of Islamic Civilisation, Art Museum, Science Museum, Archaeology Museum, and the Salsali Private Museum where several of my photographs are held in the permanent collection. Isidora will be delighted to explore how her diverse experience can contribute to the AHFAP offer and will be glad to tap into my personal contacts across major national and international museums, and institutions such as RPS, TPG and the NUJ. Key areas Isidora would be excited to explore as AHFAP chair include:

Outreach

- Refine AHFAP outreach and expand members network by means of engagement with Cultural Heritage specialists.
- Encourage in-person discussions and regular meet-ups, to expand community, connect fractions and attract new interest.
- Improve offer across the UK, ensuring coverage in the North and the South.
- Align AHFAP events programme with communication and marketing content shared externally.

Education

- Partner with education sector and diverse groups.
- Encourage pear-to-pear learning within the sector, harnessing the knowledge of the more experienced members.
- Map a yearly schedule of studio visits to engage in knowledge sharing.
- Define a target for blog publishing and map frequency on yearly basis.

Services

- Boost accessibility to portfolio reviews.

Committee Management

- Streamline roles and responsibilities to improve efficiency.

Voting took place by a show of hands.

No other expressions of interest were submitted for events officer, Steve Pocock has kindly offered to stand again.

4. Proposal to extend president tenure.

The current tenure of the AHFAP president Ken Jackson is coming to an end in November 2023. The AHFAP constitutions specifies that the president position is appointed by the chair rather than elected by the membership. Given that the current chair is stepping down the committee felt that the new president should be appointed by the new chair. To give the new chair enough time to prepare for the appointment and for there to be continuity the committee proposes for Ken Jackson's tenure to be extended by 12 months on a one-off basis.
