

<u>Paint correction</u> - is a process that removes a safe amount of clear coat or paint through mechanical abrasion using various types of machine polishers. In most cases, scratches, swirl marks, buffer marks, micro-marring, cob webbing and hologram effects can be totally removed from all types of paintwork, including scratch-resistant ceramic clear coats. We do not use any fillers or glazes in our paint correction services. All imperfections are permanently removed safely.

The time it takes to complete paint correction can vary from a few hours to over 30 hours, depending on the complexity of the job. There are several levels of paint correction, including single-stage, multi-stage, and wet sanding:

Single-stage

This basic level uses one pad and one compound to remove light scratches and swirls. It's a good option for regular maintenance.

Multi-stage

This more involved process uses multiple compounding stages with progressively finer abrasives to remove deeper scratches and defects.

Wet sanding

This is the most intensive level, where a technician uses abrasive paper soaked in water to remove severe scratches. After correcting the paint, you should apply a sealant wax, ceramic coating, or other protective layer to maintain the results.
