### **Guidelines for Display Donations Effective 10-1-2018**

**Submissions may be submitted from January 1st - August 31st of each year  
Submissions are accepted or rejected within 60 days of submission**

1. All new displays must be submitted for approval by Nature's Coastal Holiday. Nature's Coastal Holiday reserves the right to reject any submission without cause. Submission should be made either via e-mail or regular mail and include contact information- name, address, daytime phone number, e-mail address.
2. A concept drawing with approximate dimensions will be required. If the display is a ready made piece, a photo of the actual display with dimensions is required. No inflatables, plywood cut-outs, blow-molds or non-wire frames are allowed.
3. LED outdoor lighting is required. No flood lights or up/down lighting is acceptable. All lighting must be rated for outdoor use, be in good shape and attached to a wire frame which can be staked in the ground.
4. Donating parties may have their donation recognized by a sign. Displays with a bulb count of 150 and under are considered a Display level sponsor. Displays over 150 are considered an Event level sponsor. Display sponsors may increase their level of sponsorship.
5. All displays and their components become the property of Nature's Coastal Holiday to set-up/take-down/maintain and are no-returnable to the donor. Nature's Coastal Holiday has the right to pull a display or use it without recognizing the donating party except by paid sponsorship. Location of the display is the sole decision of Nature's Coastal Holiday.
6. Other outdoor holiday decorations may be donated. Items that are in need of repair or need to be restrung will be accepted upon approval.
7. Nature's Coastal Holiday reserves the right to modify, change or discontinue it's Display Donation Guidelines at any time and without notice.
