

8 Questions to Ask at the End of Your Job Interview

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Let's face it. Job interviews can be daunting sometimes. Your head is spinning with information and sometimes the interviewer isn't skilled at interviewing. So let's make it easy to conclude your job interview by asking some good questions:

1. What are the most important things you'd like me to accomplish in the first three months if I'm hired for this position?
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2. How do you see my skills and experience fitting with the needs of your company?
 3. Is there anything at all you'd like me to clarify for you?
 4. What are the prospects for growth in this job?
 5. What do you enjoy most about working here?
 6. How is performance typically measured and reviewed?
 7. When do you expect to be making a hiring decision?
 8. May I follow up with you to find out your decision? (Ask for their physical business card, so that you have a way to follow up and write a thank you note after the interview, because emails can get erased).

Summary:

Even if your skills and experience aren't quite what the company is looking for, these questions will show the employer that you've taken responsibility to find out the answers.
