St Andrews Old Course (Ballot)

Founded: 1552

The oldest and most iconic golf course in the world. The Swilcan Bridge and Hell Bunker are recognised across the globe, yet the greatest feature of the Old Course is that despite its grand status it remains a public golf course, open to all.

Handicap limits 36: Proof of Official Handicap required on day of play.

Ballot Process:

- To enter the ballot there must be at least two players and all names, Home Clubs and handicaps will be required.
- The ballot closes at 2pm two days before you hope to play.
- The result of the ballot is available after 4.30pm the same day the ballot closes.
- If successful, a current official handicap card (Golf Club affiliated to a Golf Union/Association) record or certificate must be presented to the starter prior to play. Unfortunately they do not accept letters of introduction from your local Club Professional.
- As the Old Course is closed on Sundays there is no Friday ballot.

Green Fee will be payable direct to the starter on the day.

Kingsbarns Links

Founded: 2000

Golf at Kingsbarns dates back to 1793, according to golf historian Bobby Burnet, with a nine-hole course once located on part of the current site. During World War II, the military took control of the course, as they considered the Kingsbarns beach a potential invasion point. The course vanished until American architect Kyle Phillips revitalized the area at the close of the 20th century.

Phillips drew inspiration from various courses, including Royal Dornoch, to create a design that blended seamlessly with the natural landscape. With the aid of earthmovers who relocated hundreds of thousands of tonnes of earth, Kingsbarns' distinctive terrain was shaped. When the course officially opened in July 2000, it was met with widespread acclaim, and the layout fits so effortlessly into its surroundings that it feels like it has been there for centuries.

A highlight of Kingsbarns Golf Links is the breathtaking view of the North Sea, visible from almost every hole. The course also features its own burn, the Cambo, which was uncovered during the earthworks. The landscape is perfect for golf, with rolling fairways, natural humps, and deep hollows.

Carnoustie Championship Links

Founded: 1842

The game of golf has been played in Carnoustie for well over four centuries. The first indication that the game was being played in the Angus town can be found in the Parish Records of 1560 when the game of gowff was mentioned and there is every indication that the game has played an important part in the town's life ever since.

Carnoustie is renowned for its formidable bunkers, with an abundance of them scattered across the course—some alarmingly deep and unforgiving. The par-five 6th hole, measuring 520 yards from the white tees, is widely regarded as one of the best in the world. Known as Hogan's Alley, it pays tribute to the legendary Ben Hogan, who won The Open Championship here in 1953. The tee shot is particularly intimidating, with two imposing bunkers sitting in the middle of the fairway and a third lurking on the right, ready to punish any errant drives.

Royal Troon Championship Links

Founded: 1878

Founded in 1878 by a few enthusiasts, Troon Golf Club soon outgrew its purely local reputation. The Old Course today represents a stern golfing examination and in particular the inward half of Royal Troon is widely accepted as the most demanding of any Course on the Championship rota.

Royal Troon is a classic out-and-back links course. The opening holes are relatively straightforward, with a series of short par fours running along the Firth of Clyde, offering stunning views. On a clear day, you can see the distant Ailsa Craig to the south and the towering mountains of the Isle of Arran to the west.

The par 71 course measures 7,385 yards from the championship tees, but positioning is more important than sheer distance. Bunkers are scattered throughout, many of which are hidden from view off the tees. There's also plenty of deep rough, along with patches of gorse and broom to penalize errant shots.

It's wise to score well on the outward nine, as the back nine can be challenging, especially when playing into the prevailing north-westerly wind. The stretch from the 7th to the 13th offers a diverse and intriguing challenge, often considered one of the finest sequences of holes in the game.

The Ailsa course at Trump Turnberry is not just a golf course; it's a legend in the world of golf. Renowned for its rich history, including hosting four Open Championships, The Ailsa stands as a beacon of golfing excellence on Scotland's rugged west coast. The course, named after the iconic Ailsa Craig visible from its fairways, has been meticulously redesigned to enhance its natural coastal beauty and the strategic challenge it presents to golfers.

The signature lighthouse hole is a testament to the course's blend of beauty and challenge, demanding precision and strategy. The Ailsa's finishing holes are among the most exhilarating in golf, providing a fitting climax to a round that spans the spectrum of golfing emotions.

Prestwick Championship Links

Founded: 1851

Prestwick Golf Club, the Birthplace of the Open Championship, welcomes all golfers from around the world to come and enjoy our testing historic Links. Situated on a stretch of golfing terrain unrivalled in the world, Prestwick is less than a couple of hours travel from all the other Open Championship courses in Scotland and is a must play for any discerning lover of the game.


The course is a timeless classic, with an authentic design that weaves through rugged dunes and undulating fairways. It features numerous blind holes and deep, sleepered bunkers, complete with wooden steps leading down to their depths. The greens are notoriously firm and fast, some tucked in hollows while others sit atop raised plateaus. Most are relatively small, with challenging borrows to navigate.

One of Prestwick's standout features is the variety and quality of its holes. The 1st, a par four known as "Railway," is one of the most intimidating starts in golf, with railway tracks running along the right-hand side, ready to catch any wayward slices. The 3rd, a short par five (stroke index 1) called "Cardinal," is renowned for its deep bunker, supported by railway sleepers. The 5th, a blind par three called "Himalayas," requires a tee shot to carry over a massive sand dune.



What is an Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA)?

An ETA is a digital travel permission allowing entry to the UK for visits of up to 6 months.

Eligibility depends on:

- Your travel date.
- Your nationality, as listed on your passport.

Here's What You Need To Know:

- Starting 8th January 2025, visitors from non-EU countries, and from 5th March 2025, visitors from EU countries, will be required to obtain an ETA before travelling to the UK.
- The ETA will cost £10 per applicant and will be linked to your passport.
- It will allow multiple trips and be valid for two years or until your passport expires, whichever comes first.
- Every traveller must complete the ETA application process online. Please visit <u>GOV.UK</u> for further information on who can get an ETA and how to apply before coming to the UK.


