WELLNESS CHECK

Feeling stressed or overwhelmed? Here's a calming breathing & mindfulness technique that you can do anywhere:

- 1. Sit in a comfortable position.
- 2. Relax your shoulders.
- 3. Place your feet flat on the floor.
- 4. Seal your lips (+ option to close your eyes).
- 5. Repeat a positive affirmation in your head as you complete steps 6-9 (ex., "I can do this," "I am capable," etc.).
- 6. Inhale through your nose for 4 seconds.
- 7. Hold your breath at the top for 4 seconds.
- 8. Slowly exhale from your nose for 4 seconds (*Tip: Gently constrict the back of your throat to activate your Uijayi breath*).
- 9. Repeat 6 times.
