Tournaments score Club profits

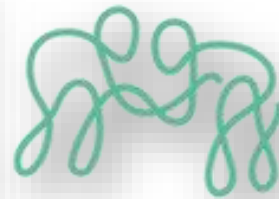
Net income in October was \$1,781—in large part due to tournaments.

January through October, net income was \$32,818. The Every easement settlement had a huge impact, along with

holding cash reserves to meet upcoming expenses for residential lot sales rather than paying off equipment debt.

Greens fees, range balls and cart rentals contributed \$18,556 year to date. Tournaments brought in \$9,697. These are the extra funds that keep the Club operational, as dues alone are insufficient.

Whether you volunteer to get the course ready, play a tournament or are willing to work with Brandon Montgomery to run a tournament, you are directly contributing to the Club's sustainability.



A place for youth wrestling practice

The Caney youth wrestling program faced a dilemma in finding a practice location due to facility closures for quarantine.

Michael Freisburg, a volunteer wrestling organizer and coach, as well as a member, proposed renting the clubhouse's dining room on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6 to 7:30 pm.

To aid this short-term community youth recreational need, the board approved its use in December, January and February. The normal clubhouse rental fee will be waived. To protect the Club, the wrestling program will provide facility liability insurance and pay \$100 to offset utilities and toiletries expenses.
