

## Lots of progress

With the survey now completed, contracts to purchase 6 acres on the north boundary, and to sell the first lot can be readied.

In addition, a subdivision plat can be readied for the Montgomery County Commission. After approval, members will be given a 30-day notice period to make their interest in purchasing a specific lot known.

While progress is not visible, the board is working diligently to breathe life to the plan.

## It's always something!

**1 win:** Thanks to member Mike Smith, two loads of gravel will be applied to the cart paths.

**2 must-haves:** The north concrete bridge on No. 4 and west cement bridge on No. 2 are critical for mower access. Volunteers worked to fix these top two needs. Others remain to be worked in the future.

**3 challenges:** Slowing maintenance and adding to expenses: the tractor's front end and rough mower fuel leak were addressed by Derrick Roberts, but the rough mower's hydraulic leak needed more extensive help.

**4 other maintenance needs being tackled** are a workaround in June to ameliorate an over-patched sprinkler line on No. 5's dam until a more permanent replacement can be carried out. Tree canopy needs to be lifted to 8 foot for rough mower's cab roof. (Volunteers needed) Yardage markers will be welded as needed and accurately sited. New flagsticks will replace those that have splintered. An anonymous member has donated new flags.

## Tournament rainout?

A policy for multiple-day tournament rainouts is being formulated. It will be posted on the bulletin board rather than written on flyers. Notification plans include use of social media.
