

GAMES FOR PUTT CHALLENGE

English

ONE PLAYER:

1. STROKE PLAY

The object of the game is to make less points after 18 holes.

Pars are worth 0 points, bogies are worth 1 and birdies -1 points. The player will hit one put from each hole adding the corresponding points after each hole and after 18 holes the total of point will be the final score.

2. HOW FAR CAN YOU GO

The object of the game is to putt the 18 holes without making a bogie.

If you make a bogie you have to start again from hole 1. Every birdie you make will be a life that you can use to save you from a bogie, so if you have a life (birdie) and you make a bogie use that life and you may go to the next hole.

3. AGAINST THE CLOCK

The object of the game is to putt the 18 holes in less time.

If you make a bogie you have to repeat that hole until you make a par or a birdie. For every birdie that you make you will subtract 5 seconds from your final time. You cannot touch the ball on the par zone until it comes to a complete stop. If you think your putt is not going to make it you can retrieve the ball at any time. You can start walking towards the hole right after you hit your shot. You can pick up your ball after each putt and place it on your next hole. Time start counting when you hit the first putt and stops counting when the ball stops after your shot on 18.

TWO PLAYERS:

1. MATCH PLAY

Both players hit from each hole and compete to win the hole, the best score on each hole will win the hole and at the end of the 18 holes the player with the most holes won will win the match. If at the end of 18 holes there is a tie they will start putting from hole 1 again until a player wins a hole and the match will end and the player who won the last hole will be the winner.

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If a player gets a birdie and the opponent gets a bogie in a hole the birdie wins the hole does not matter that he or she won by 2 strokes it is the same as winning by one stroke with a par against a bogie.

The way to count the score is by calling the name of a player and saying how many holes the player is up or down against the opponent, Example: Bob is 2 up or Fredy is 3 down or all square(that means that both players have won the same number of holes)

The match may end up early if one player is up for more than the number of holes left to play, for example Bob is up by 3 and there is only 2 holes to play, then the match is over because even if the opponent wins the remaining holes he or she will not be able to win at the end of 18 holes.

2. STROKE PLAY

The player with the lowest score after 18 holes will win the match.

Players can alternate shots hole by hole or one player plays the 18 holes and then the other player plays the 18 holes both starting from hole one and following the order until they play the 18 holes, remember a par is worth 0 points a bogie is 1 point and a birdie is -1 point

THREE OR MORE PLAYERS:

3. FALLING CHIPS

For this game you will need some type of chips: Poker chips, golf tees, or even raw beans, you will need 5 chips per player.

If you would like to play for money, assign an amount per chip, for example \$1 per chip. Before play starts, each player buys 5 chips and puts one in the pot.

Each player hits starting from hole one. If a player makes a birdie takes a chip from the pot, if a player makes a bogey puts a chip in the pot and if after every one makes the putt the player's putt was the worst of the group puts another chip on the pot, for example: If there are four players: One makes a birdie(he/she takes one chip from the pot) two players make par (they do nothing) and the 4th players make a bogey (he/she will put two chips on the pot: one for the bogey and one for being the worst), but if there was a 5th player and made bogey the 4th player would only pay one chip for the bogey because now he/she was not the single worst score, Players who have no more chips are out of the game.



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Play continues until: a) There is only one player left with chips. In this case the player with chips will take all the chips left on the pot. b) More than one player reaches the 18 hole, in this case the chips left on the pot will remain on the pot and play will start over from hole 1, the players that had lost all their chips can play again as long as they buy another 5 chips. The players that reached the 18 holes may buy chips up to 5 chips, if a player has 5 or more chips he/she can not buy any more chips. Before play resumes all the player must put 1 chip in the pot

When the group decides that play is over the chips remaining on the pot will be evenly divided among all the players even among the players that lost earlier in that game.

Note: If a player makes a birdie but there are no chips on the pot the player will not collect a chip and will not recover that chip even if later in the game chips fall in the pot

TEAMS:

The games for one or two players can be played in a team format, teams will consist of 2 players, one player plays the odd holes and the other team member plays the even hole
