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

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) defines transitional housing as "a project that has its purpose facilitating the movement of homeless individuals and families to permanent housing within a reasonable amount of time."

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MONKEY POX "Questions and Answers"

Ouestion:

What are the signs and symptoms of monkeypox?

Answer:

Human monkeypox often begins with a combination of the following symptoms: fever, headache, chills, exhaustion, asthenia, lymph node swelling, back pain and muscle aches. A rash commonly develops one to three days after the onset of fever, first appearing on the face and spreading to other parts of the body, including hands and feet.

Question:

Is there a vaccine for Monkey Pox?

Answer:

Varma says people are receiving one of two available vaccines for smallpox, which have been shown to be effective against monkeypox:

- ACAM2000, the original smallpox vaccine
- JYNNEOS, a newer vaccine

The vaccine is estimated to be around 85% effective at monkeypox prevention, but the research is currently limited.

Question:

How long is a person with Monkey Pox contagious?

Answer:

When a blister has turned into a scab and the scab has fallen off, and new skin is covering where the blister and scab once was. People are receiving one of two available vaccines for smallpox, which have been shown to be effective against monkeypox:
