IN MEMORIAM

Danny Whitacre, a man we must remember with great respect for the capacity with which he stepped up to volunteer his time, funds, and life to serve and protect our country. In the hopes of passing along his passion to stand up and fight, I pass along a portion of his story.

Danny was a man who cared deeply about the Constitution and preserving our Republican form of Government - designed and maintained by, and for, We, The People. He recently built his own business in 2019 known as Dan Whitacre Consultants, a firm set out to guide startups toward success. Dan was a husband and father as well as a dedicated patriot.

CANDIDACY

Danny began looking at the administration of his own state’s elections, took issue, and came to the conclusion that local action was the only path forward. His decision to pursue the role of Kenton County Clerk was spurred by the tenure of the incumbent. Gabrielle Summe has won the nomination of the Republican Party in the County for at least the last twelve years, subsequently winning the position.

In 2020, Gabrielle was a major proponent of mail-in ballots for county elections. She is on video pushing the use of absentee ballots on the Kenton County YouTube channel. This may have simply been a sign of the times, though still telling of her overall integrity. Additionally Danny cited the following issues he took with Gabrielle Summe’s legacy: her commitment to electronic voting machines, multiple days of early voting, her implementation of “voting centers” rather than lawful in-precinct voting, duplicate registrations, registrations of former county residents, voters registered in multiple states, and dead voters casting ballots. Her repeated denial of election fraud, in agreement with Kentucky Secretary of State Michael Adams, calling the suggestion of potential fraud “unfounded” likely added to Danny’s resolve to get to the whole truth.

He desired to commit to cleaning up local elections for all lawful Kenton County voters.
