

CHANGEMAKERS COMMITTED TO LEADERSHIP & GOVERNANCE













One Step A La Vez (OSALV) began our grassroots campaign in 2007 to respond to the pressing need for a community center to serve youth and their families in the communities of Fillmore and Piru. Our founder Lynn Edmonds and a handful of Latino teens recognized the absence of essential services available in the neighboring areas such as counseling, drug and alcohol cessation programs, domestic violence support groups, and the lack of a safe haven for teens to spend time afterschool. This grassroots movement propelled the establishment of OSALV and these efforts continuously evolve to better meet the needs of our teens and their families.

OSALV affirms our commitment to our mission of serving the communities of Santa Clara Valley by providing a safe environment for 13-19 year olds and preparing informed, co-powered youth who are equipped with the tools to lead; cultivate cultural awareness; bridge the gaps of inequality; and advocate for fair, just and healthy individuals and community.

One Step A La Vez has become a safe haven for teens to gather after school and obtain access to a hot meal and program activities that help them grow, build character and unlock their potential.

One Step A La Vez is committed to the values of Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (J.E.D.I). These are action-driven behaviors that we practice throughout all levels of our organization. Our history in addressing systemic barriers deepens our commitment to these values. We are a community-centric organization that serves teens who identify with their Latino background, culture, and roots and our board, staff, donors, and volunteers represent the diversity found in the community we serve.

We have adopted hiring practices to ensure that we have culturally proficient staff that connect with the struggle faced by many of our teens. This makes us empathetic to understanding their issues and leads to effective youth outcomes.

J.E.D.I is at the heart of our mission as we believe that every teen – regardless of who they are – deserves an equal opportunity to thrive and succeed in school, work, and life. To cement these values is a moral imperative but also the foundation for building strong, resilient, and healthy communities. Our organization is rooted in the struggle towards social and racial justice and equality and our commitment continues as we serve the needs of the historically underserved and underrepresented throughout the Santa Clara River Valley.



Our caring and dedicated staff is committed to delivering the highest level of service and support to the teens and families served by **One Step A La Vez**. Their lived experience makes our staff exceptional mentors to our teens who are struggling to find their way by addressing adverse childhood experiences.





In 2024 alone we have served nearly 300 teens in communities of Fillmore, Piru, and Santa Paula.


100% Teens identify as Hispanic/Latino with deep roots in their Mexican culture.

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CIRCLE OF CARE

A monthly community collaborative representing different service providers, community stakeholders, and county and local agencies that work together to find community-based solutions.



EVENING REPORTING CENTER

Youth are referred through the Ventura County Probation Agency or members of the community (school, community members, law enforcement) and complete their courtappointed community service requirements and are also provided individual case management.



Staff, youth, and volunteers coordinate our twice-monthly food distributions to local families to combat hunger and food insecurity.

One Step A La Vez utilizes the 8 Dimensions of Wellness to craft program activities that contribute to overall well-being for teens and families we serve.

ADELANTE

The generous investment from the McCune and Weingart Foundation made it possible for **One Step A La Vez** to build its capacity to organize and helped reignite its commitment to advance social justice. The ability to hire Maria Robles, as our Community Organizer was key to building our Adelante program, which created a training ground that empowered our teens to find their voice and address issues impacting their lives. Our teens unlocked advocacy and community organizing skills and are on the path to becoming community change-makers.
