

**Horse Camps** 

Listed below are a couple of favorite Horse camps that looks like a lot of fun. If you love trail riding and going new places, this may be an adventure worth looking in to! Also remember to check out **www.TrailMeister.com** for the largest guide to horse camps in the US!

HORSE CAMP OF CHIHUAHUA VALLEY—A Horse camp made by horse people, for horse people in Warner Springs, CA! Horse Campground with 40 acres, with access to California Riding and Hiking Trail and 3 Miles to the Pacific Crest Trail. 15 campsites with 2 corrals each. 10 extra corrals, large arena, round pen, wash racks, hitching posts, flushing toilets, and showers. #### MONTAÑA DE ORO STATE PARK—HAZARD CANYON HORSE CAMPS—

Near Morro Bay, about a 5 hour drive (with trailer) from Rancho. The riding makes it all worth the trip as you have beach riding, mountain riding, and Eucalyptus forests to explore! Temperatures remain mild here year round which makes it the perfect escape from So Cal summer months. Dry Camp, with pit toilet, horse corrals, and water available for horses. www.parks.ca.gov/pages/592/files/MontanaDeOroSP

MCCALLS MEMORIAL CAMPGROUND— A close getaway 4 miles south of Idyllwild, CA in the San Jacinto Mtns. At a 4400 foot level McCalls is the perfect getaway to relax with your equine partners! With plenty of corrals and space, this camp has nice bathrooms and pay showers, sturdy corrals and a round pen. There is a camp store/gas station a few minutes up the road in Mountain Center, and numerous eateries in Idyllwild for a quick bite. The sunset views are amazing. Reserve at

GREEN VALLEY HORSE CAMP- A getaway located about 20 minutes outside of Julian, CA Green Valley Horse Camp is a family horse camping area. The site has 15 equestrian family camp sites that can accommodate up to 8 people and two horses each site. The camp includes 2 ADA campsites. Bathrooms, water, and pay showers are available. This camp is part of the beautiful Cuyamaca Rancho State Park. Please note, this camp does close from November 30-March 31 annually due to inclement weather closing trails. BOGART REGIONAL PARK-- Located in Cherry Valley, CA-close yet a world away! Located at the base of the San Gorgonio Mtns lies a close yet quiet little getaway. Bogart Regional Park is minutes away from Yucaipa located in Cherry Valley, CA. Bogart Regional Park offers miles of foothill riding against the backdrop of the San Gorgonio Mountain Range. Campground is next to the seasonal Noble Creek. Showers and bathrooms are available, but a bit of a walk from the equestrian camp so be prepared. # Heritage Park Equestrian Center Pedestrian Bridge

Update: Heritage Park Equestrian Center Pedestrian Bridge over Demens Channel

As you all may know, the horse/pedestrian bridge from the wilderness area/obstacle Course on the west side of the equestrian center leading to Heritage Park proper (baseball fields) was damaged by vandals. The city had engineers examine the bridge and determined it was unsafe. The city subsequently closed and blocked the bridge.

The good news is that The City has informed the Alta Loma Riding Club that they have begun the process of replacing the bridge. They have found an engineering firm to design and engineer a replacement bridge, and the contract is ready to go to Council for approval. While the bridge replacement process is started, there are the usual delays, the design process, permits from local, county, and state agencies, the bid process and of course the actual building of the bridge. We will keep you updated with the progress and delays if any.

# How to Report Park Vandalism

There continues to be incidents of vandalism by motorbikes riding in the arenas. If you see damage to the arenas, please take a moment to take a photo and then report it to the City when you get home. We need to report these incidents to the City so they can track the damages being done to our parks.

Here are the steps to report the arena vandalism:

- 1. Take photos of the arena damage
- 2. Go online to www.cityofrc.us
- 3. Under "Online Services" click on Report an Issue
- 4. The RC2GO Reporting form will appear. Select "park maintenance"
- 5. Fill out your name, phone, email address, location, and details about the problem.
- 6. Attached your photos to the form and submit.
