For most equestrians, there is a special place they go to with their horse that they can't wait to go to again and again. For me it's our annual trip to Montana de Oro near Morro Bay.



#### SIGNS OF HEAT STRESS

- Increased rectal temperatures (102.5 or higher)
- Increased respiratory rate
- · Increased heart rate
- Profuse sweating (or no sweat if horse has anhidrosis)
- Horse is lethargic
- Dehydration (prolonged skin tent, tacky mucous membranes)
- Recumbency or difficulty
  rising

#### REDUCING HEAT STRESS RISKS

- Provide free access to clean water
- Offer a salt block or free minerals
- Provide shade and ensure adequate air flow
- Clip horses with long coats
- Watch for signs of sunburn on white or light-colored areas (muzzle, ears, around the eves)
- Allow time for the horse to acclimate to the heat by gradually increasing exercise
