MESSAGE FROM 1ST VICE PRESIDENT MARTHA COWAN

Dear ALRC Members,

The year 2025 is proving to be an interesting, and ultimately rewarding year for the Alta Loma Riding Club. This year, beginning within the next several months, the main bridge leading into the facility's parking lot will be rebuilt. While construction is in process, the types of events we will be able to hold at the park are limited. There will be the usual local rides and trailer out rides, with other offsite plans in the works, and we will keep the membership informed of events via our monthly newsletter and social media.

Another project that is in the works to complete during this time is the refurbishing of the interior of clubhouse, which has not been updated since it was built over 40 years ago. We are planning new lighting, new paint, new flooring, and possibly heating and air. The estimate for completing this work is approximately \$30,000. We must do fundraising to achieve this goal, and we are appealing to the ALRC Membership for donations. There will bedetails about how to donate coming soon.

Heritage Park Bridge Project Update

The Heritage Park Equestrian Center Bridge Project is scheduled to start the first of May. As of the City's last update, the permits were all approved and the project was slated to go out to bid the first of March, the award of the bid the first of April and the start of the project the first of May. This means that the parking lot for Heritage Park Equestrian Center will be completely closed starting in May of 2025. The City has given ALRC the time line of worst case scenario at 12 months. This being the case, the ALRC has cleared the calendar of all EVENTS scheduled at Heritage Park Equestrian Center from May 2025 to May 2026. While there are no formal events scheduled, the equestrian center will remain open for ride in use. Hillside is also an option for parking if you feel comfortable tacking up on the street. While this is inconvenient, it is quite necessary to get the bridge rebuilt. Access to the equestrian center (ride or walk in) will remain the same except the main parking lot bridge. Trash cans will be set up on the west side of the South Arena for manure, please clean up after your horses.

The Equestrian Center during the above time frame will be more difficult to access for emergency services, no vehicular traffic. The Alta Loma Riding Club is recommending that while using the facility you are there with at least one other person. We are also suspicious activity, including homeless, please call the police.

The weekend of February 28, 2025, the facility will be closed from 7:00 Am to 6:00 Pm. The City has purchased the sand to refurbish the arenas and there will be tractor work being conducted in both arenas. While we will not be working in both arenas at the same time, the tractors may spook your horse/s so ALRC recommends avoiding the area while the work is being completed. We will leave one of the arenas available for use after 6:00 Pm each night. Please if you have questions check the Website for updates or call me to see if the facility is available. I may not answer if I am on the tractor so I will get back to you when I am available.

We need to report these incidents to the City so they can track the damages being done to our parks.

Here are the steps to report the arena vandalism:

- 1. Take photos of the arena damage
- 2. Go online to www.cityofrc.us
- 3. Under "Online Services" click on Report an Issue
- 4. The RC2GO Reporting form will appear. Select "park maintenance"
- 5. Fill out your name, phone, email address, location, and details about the problem.
- 6. Attached your photos to the form and submit.
