
Please Be Aware!

Heritage Park Equestrian Center Bridge Closure

The City has chosen a contractor and the bridge construction is scheduled to start on June 23, 2025. This means that the parking lot will be closed from June 23, 2025 with an expected completion date of sometime in February 2026, barring of course any unforeseen issues (i.e. weather). The equestrian center arenas will continue to be maintained and ride in use is still available. The City has approved the use of Hillside for parking trailers, but unloading horses in the street is not ideal and extra caution is recommended. The city website will have ongoing updates as well as updates in the ALRC newsletter and website. Please continue to access the ALRC Website for information on events held off site.

Alta Loma Large Animal Emergency Response Team

(ALERT) UPDATE:

On Sunday May 18, 2025, the Alta Loma Riding Club, Rancho Cucamonga Animal Control, Rancho Cucamonga Fire Department, San Bernardino County Sheriff's Rancho Cucamonga Equestrian Patrol and community members attended a "Table Top" exercise regarding the mass evacuation of Large Animals in the event of a catastrophic fire in the hills above Rancho Cucamonga. There were also hands on exercises to determine best practices and procedures, and best practices for horse owners to save their horses.

Alta Loma Riding Club will be presenting clinics on topics regarding preparation and supplies for evacuating your horse. **IF YOUR HORSE OR LARGE ANIMAL DOES NOT LOAD IN A TRAILER, PLEASE FIND SOMEONE TO HELP YOU IN TRAINING.** The members of the Alta Loma Riding Club ALERT will not have time train your horse to trailer load during a mass evacuation event. In addition, have a personal evacuation plan for your animals. For additional information on upcoming clinics, presentations and information, please check the ALRC Website and Newsletter regularly.

How to Report Park Vandalism

There continues to be incidents of vandalism by motorbikes riding in the arenas. If you see damage to the arenas, please take a moment to take a photo and then report it to the City when you get home. We need to report these incidents to the City so they can track the damages being done to our parks.

Here are the steps to report the arena vandalism:

1. Take photos of the arena damage
2. Go online to www.cityofrc.us
3. Under "Online Services" click on Report an Issue
4. The RC2GO Reporting form will appear. Select "park maintenance"
5. Fill out your name, phone, email address, location, and details about the problem.
6. Attached your photos to the form and submit.
