LTA LOMA RIDING

Heritage Park Equestrian Center Bridge Replacement Project Update

The City of Rancho Cucamonga (the City) has finalized designs, plans, and has obtained permits for the Equestrian Center Bridge Replacement Project. As you all know, the bridge is dilapidated and needs to be replaced. The city, as a stop gap, added a steel plate to the bridge for safety, pending plans and permits to rebuild the bridge. The bridge traverses a county flood control channel, which requires approvals and permits from several agencies. The project has become much larger than originally thought, as the bridge cannot merely be replaced as is, all current building codes must be adhered to and engineering from several agencies have included minimum standards

The bridge, as planned, designed and approved, will be a stand-alone structure, self-supporting and arching slightly up and over the Demens channel. This contrasts with the current bridge which rests, at least partially, on the channel and does not meet current building codes. The original speculation of the parking lot being un-accessible for three months has grown to 9 to 12 months. The city anticipates starting the project in April 2025. While the city has obtained all plans and permits to start the project, they still must go out to bid for the project. This means that the City, and therefore the Alta Loma Riding Club, are still speculating the start and completion dates until a company is selected through the bid process.

The City and the ALRC are still looking for alternatives for parking trailers. The equestrian access points to the facility, other than the main bridge, will remain open, so walk in use will still be available. The City and the ALRC are in conversations regarding contingencies and will keep the membership and the general public updated through our newsletters and social media sites.
