Many may have seen Cary Westscott around the ALRC community; riding his horse Baby and grooming the arenas at Heritage Park. Now get to know him a little better! It was fun for me to interview Cary for our April Member Spotlight.

Cary's story starts on a farm in Nebraska where he was born and spent his early years. And even though at age 4 his family moved to Southern California, and settled in the La Habra/Whittier area, Cary's roots run deep in rich Nebraska farmland. Every year he spent his summers back on his grandparents farm; doing chores, learning to ride horses and falling in to bed each night with the right kind of exhaustion from a day well spent! He grew up respecting his elders and a hard day's work. Cary also had an adventurous side that kept him seeking new horizons. But after graduating from high school, his plans of surfing down the coast of Mexico were interrupted by a golden opportunity to apply for a job with the railroad. "I was hired and just could not pass up the great money!" So he left his surfing travel plans and started what would turn out be a 44 year career with the railroad!

Cary, got married and had a baby girl. As a young husband and father, he began to build a family life in Chino. Through a friend, he heard about a really good "free" quarter horse named Hondo. He thought it might be a great time to get in to horses. And get in to it he did!!

In 1993 they sought to buy horse property of their own in Alta Loma, on a particular street—and of course, that is where they live today! He often would be seen riding on the local trails atop Marshall, his 17 hand Tennessee Walker. They were quite recognizable! And Marshall attracted his own fan club LOL! I commented, "Marshall was famous!" To which Cary replied, "Actually, more like infamous!"

Four years ago, he noticed his own health and energy level diminishing. An appointment with a cardiologist revealed cardiovascular issues and the doctor scheduled him for an emergency procedure to receive a pacemaker. This caused him to reflect and make some important decisions which included retiring from his railroad career. But is Cary bored by retired life? Obviously, not a chance!!

Cary has been involved in a plethora of experiences. Whether on the back of a horse or at the helm of a sailboat, he has been looking to the horizon and collecting a lifetime of great stories along the way. And he is quite the animated story teller! Cary loves horse camping. He has been a stock handler for the elite riding group Los Caballeros, working rides in various locations including the annual trip/ride on Catalina Island. Cary and his horse Baby are HARMS certified and are part of the Rancho Cucamonga Unit #417 Equestrian Patrol of the San Bernardino Sheriffs Department. He also volunteers to maintain the Heritage Park arenas and you will see him on Fridays driving the tractor! In addition to horses, he is a sailor and has his skipper certification and belongs to Aventura Sailing Association in Dana Point. And, oh yeah, Cary also drives floats in the Rose Parade and has some great stories about that too—WOW!

One of his greatest joys is seeing his 7 year old granddaughter, Raven, fall in love with riding horses! She has an energy and enthusiasm that is simply delightful! And Grandpa is there all the way to encourage and foster this budding talent. Raven has a horse of her own now too, a spunky buckskin mare named Dallas. Rest assured, Grandpa and granddaughter will be going to events, riding trails and making memories together! Cary does not plan on slowing down anytime soon, but does reflect that, "It is important to find 'life balance' in order to truly



be content". Cary has been a long time member of ALRC and his presence, personality and service has been a genuine gift to our equestrian community!




