President's Message

Merry Christmas. This is the season where our time and attention are drawn away from our equine partners. There are just a couple of thoughts I would like to share. First, there is a great deal of stress associated with this time of year and one way dealing with it is therapy, and there is no better therapy than horse therapy. Everyone who owns a horse I'm sure will agree with me. So when you are stressed and feeling the pressure of the season, go out and pick up horse poop, or groom your horse. If you want to make points with your neighbors, offer to relieve some of their stress and have them go pick up your horses poop. The next thought is working with your horse does not have to take hours, 10 minutes doing ground work helps keep your equine partner listening to you. "If you aren't training, you are un-training"

As many of you have heard, there was an issue with the bridges on the west side of the park, traversing over the concrete channels. The Public works Department was proposing the removal of all five bridges around the Heritage Park and replacing them with just one bridge located at the main entrance of the Heritage Park Equestrian Center. This was stated on a phone call to me by a city engineer as well as in person to Larry Henderson at a Public Works meeting on October 30, 2019. With the help of the community and members of ALRC we were able to mobilize the community and show significant opposition to the project. I want to thank all the people that showed up at the meeting as well as those that brought horses, and dogs to the council meeting on November 20th. Our opposition was heard and all modifications to the bridges have been tabled until January. The City Manager apologized for the miscommunication and said that the bridges on the west side of the park were still in good condition and were not scheduled for removal at this time. While I am cautiously optimistic that the city will not remove the bridges that so many of us use on a daily basis, I believe that we need to remain vigilant to insure that our trails and bridges are maintained or replaced if necessary. There was great deal of information posted online regarding the proposal if you need additional information. We do have a voice in the community, if we are willing to spend the time and effort necessary to make it heard. I want to thank the City Council for supporting the community. If any of you have any questions about what happened please feel free to contact me.

They plan on making the 3 bridges leading into the equestrian parking lot (equestrian, vehicle, and pedestrian) into one multi-use bridge. The many users of these bridges and the trail system, including the washed out trail around Canyon Creek Ranch, made a very impressive showing at the city council meeting on Wednesday, November 20. Many citizens voiced their concerns about safety and the benefits to our community of having an extensive, connective trail system, which includes these bridges. Many more would have spoken if we hadn't run out of time. The immediate outcome is, instead of voting on the bridges plan at the very next city council meeting on December 4, they are going to do some more research and postpone the vote until the end of January or beginning of February. With numbers, we can make a difference!


