

Old Friends Farm has almost 130 horses grazing on its lush acres in retirement. Silver Charm, who won the 1997 Kentucky Derby and Preakness, is now a happy retired 20 year old that is one of the most popular retirees at the farm. Visitors from all over the nation come to visit the horses there and hopefully spread the word that these wonderful athletes deserve a comfortable retirement.

Besides getting out and riding my boy Riley and walking my pooch Ozzie, I have been finding lots of old TV Programs that I watched as a child. One of my favorites when I was young was Death Valley Days with the Old Ranger. Turns out it

> plays on old TV Classic channels and also on Hulu. So, I have been enjoying some wonderful old true stores (albeit a bit dramatized) in the evenings.




Another program dealt with an early outlaw in California that rode a White Horse and although ending up at the end of a rope, was well known for his riding capabilities.
