# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We have 3 months left in 2021, and ALRC has something for each month! Be sure to check out our St. Jude Children's Hospital Charity Obstacle event at the beginning of October. November brings our Dutch Oven Event and Thanksgiving Hangover Horse Show. We wrap up December 2021 with our popular Local Christmas Lights Ride!

We live and ride in an environment where equestrians, pedestrians, and vehicles often share common spaces. As equestrians, we are naturally in a more vulnerable position, and often come across folks who don't know what situations can be spooky to horses. This places more responsibility on riders to ride defensively, and to be effective leaders to our horses when they are fearful of something. Too often, I have seen folks on horseback reprimand others in an effort to control a situation they were uncomfortable with. The rider ultimately felt the need to reprimand because they were afraid of getting hurt. They were afraid of getting hurt because rider and horse were not properly prepared for handling a common trail dynamic, or fear response. All parties walk away with a bad taste in their mouth over the interaction, and equestrians are cast in a negative light to the general public—but it doesn't have to be that way.

Bicycles, skateboards, drones, gardening equipment, barking dogs, garbage cans, etc are all common situations seen out on our local trails that can affect a horse's (and rider's) reactivity. It is important to expose your horses to these dynamics in a controlled environment (like an arena) before venturing out on trail to ensure



a safest possible scenario. In doing so, the rider learns how to effectively handle their horse's fear response, as well as the horse learning how to navigate spooky situations in a productive way. It is our responsibility as equestrians to set our horses up for success, and be ambassadors to everyone we meet for the equestrian lifestyle. "Just a trail horse" said no trail rider ever, we work hard to make it look easy!

In short—plan on heading over to Heritage Park Equestrian Center for our fun upcoming activities, practice scaring the crap out of your horse (in a controlled manner), and breath in the brief, crisp hints of the upcoming change in season. Sounds like a pretty good time to me!

Deck out your horse with lights and bells and join us for our annual ride through the neighborhoods of Alta Loma.


