Mules Around Town

First of all, a big apology to Joe Snider for getting his name so wrong!!! His participation in ALRC events with his beautiful Mule, Luna, is so very much appreciated.

This month I wanted to really bring out the incredible versatility of mules through talking to a couple of our long time ALRC members, Sue Lowry and Janet Luke. Sue and Janet were horse owners as kids but have been Mule enthusiasts since meeting Max Short, a mule lover that had a ranch on 9th Street near Cask and Cleaver. Janet and Sue bred an appaloosa mare to a Jack and never looked backed!

They drove his mule team Outriders, and participated in the 100th Anniversary Parade in Upland. Janet, as their Marshall



many times, were Rose Participants for 18 years and were very involved in Mule Days in Bishop with their friend Max.

In 1993 they rode a buggy pulled by 2 grey mules in the Clinton inaugural parade., They drove all the way from Baltimore Maryland to DC!

Mules and Canyons: Why are Mules used for cliff riding? They are very self protective, do not have flight fear, are more interested in where they put their feet and have larger eyes. John Mule stallions are more dangerous and are cut at 3 months for safety. Fertile mules are very rare as they have 63 chromosomes vs a Horse at 62. Generally mules live longer than horses. Franklin, owned by Meridith Hodges, would not only pull and wagon, he would push it too! And lived to be 44!

The first mules were brought by George Washington. He was the father of all American Mules. The King of Spain gave him two mammoth Jacks that were used for farming and produced over 300 mules. (He was a frisky little fella.)


Mules were prejudiced against for years due to ignorance and breeding experiences, and usually called "crazy mules".
