In an effort to do so, ALRC will be seeking folks willing to be on a volunteer contact list we could draw upon for help on the day of such events. We live in the land of perpetual fire season; do you have a plan in place in the event you need to unexpectedly evacuate? Public resources will be strained and possibly unavailable for immediate help in the event of a wildfire disaster. Some basic things to consider are;



identification for you horse should you become separated; a method to transport them on hand immediately (and when others are trying to do the same); a safe place to take them for a period of time; enough food and water ready for quick transport to sustain for a few days. It is an imperative part equestrian ownership here in California, to have an established plan of action to ensure timely, safe transport of our horses to a safe location in the event of a wildfire.

So, put together your wildfire plan, network with your fellow equine enthusiasts, and then jump in the saddle. Ride like a wild wind in a nighttime play day, or relax on a leisurely sunset to moonrise trail ride—both serve the ultimate goal.

STAGING INFO: Meet at Heritage Park at 8am for a quick 25 minute drive to our staging area. If you are going to meet us there, please RSVP in the Facebook event or contact Julie so we have a count of the trailers. There are several parking options depending on the size of the group. Most likely we will stage at Raging Waters. If it is a small group, however, we will park off of Scarborough.

DISTANCE: The trail is 3.8 miles long so we will be riding 7 miles or so depending on what the group wants to do.

TIME: approximately 3 hours\*

TERRAIN: Trails are fairly flat although we may do one short hill.

TECHNICALITY: We will encounter hikers and an occasional evil umbrella (Sammy wanted to make sure I mentioned that). Generally, we don't see many bikes. There will be many water crossings. Water should be fairly shallow this time of year and the crossings are often rocky but safe. Many photo opportunities on this is easy, relaxing ride.


