DESCRIPTION OF SUNSET TRAIL RIDE:

Date: Friday September 9, 2022 Time: 6:30pm-8:30 or 9pm

Staging Info: Meet at Heritage Park around 6pm and plan to leave by 6:30pm **Route:** to be determined **Distance:** 5-6ish miles

Time: 2 to 2.5 hours **Elevation:** Relatively flat **Terrain:** Relatively smooth

Technicality: Riding at night

SEPTEMBER TRAILER OUT RIDE

WRIGHTWOOD is one of my favorite places to ride. It is usually about 10 degrees cooler than Alta Loma and there is often a nice breeze under the shade of the trees.



DESCRIPTION OF TRAIL RIDE: Date: Saturday, September 17, 2022 Time: 8am-2pm

Staging & more Info: Meet at Heritage Park at 8am. The drive is about 50 minutes to Inspiration Point. Plan to be in the saddle by 9:30. Bring snacks/ lunch and water. PLEASE BE AWARE: We are staging in the Angeles National Forest, a "National Forest Adventure Pass" is to be displayed on all parked vehicles. For a list of places that carry these passes in Rancho Cucamonga like Big 5 or Bass Pro check out: https://www.fs.fed.us/portaldata/r5/ap/r5-ap-vendors.php Or they can be purchased online. \$5 per day or \$30 for the year. **Distance:** Our intended trail is 10-12 miles*

Time: Approximately 3-4 hours*

Elevation: Rolling hills about 350 feet from highest to lowest point **Terrain:** The ride is mountainous and we will cover a good bit of elevation. **Technicality:** Horses and riders need to be prepared for some challenging terrain. Several of us have done this ride numerous times and it is an adventure ride. Some parts of the trail are narrow or along a hillside.

*If the weather is extra hot, we may shorten the route or switch to an alternate ride location.

"COOL" FACTS: 单

- Horses heat up 3-10 times faster than humans.
 Exercise is a major source of body heat; even 17 minutes of gentle exercise in hot weather can raise a
- Horse's internal temperature to dangerous levels.Horses, like people, need to sweat for
- thermoregulation (cooling); sweat is more efficient at removing heat when it evaporates.

How HOT is TOO HOT to work your horse?



Heat Index > 150 USE CAUTION Watch for signs of heat stress

Heat Index < 130 ENJOY YOUR RIDE! Your horse can keep its body cool
