I am most happy to report that Heritage Park will once again be having Dressage Shows. The Inland Communities Chapter of California Dressage Society (see page 4 about CDS) has contracted with the ALRC to put on four **Dressage Shows** this year. Please jot the dates down and keep your calendars open for these events. A practice set-up on March 18, and **Dressage Horse Shows on April 15, June 11, and October 14**. Come

More exciting news, The ALRC will be hosting another first! On **February 19** in our arena we will be hosting a **Cowboy Dressage clinic and show**. Cowboy Dressage is growing in popularity throughout the

country. We will have expert training for the first part of the event and a show in the second part.

Here is a little information for those of you unfamiliar with this discipline. Not everybody has enough room for a traditional dressage ring. Many horse owners cannot afford to travel across the country to show and they may not be





members of the pertinent organization. Others do not have the time to ride their horses every day. Some may not even have horses they can ride, but the groundwork is an important aspect of Cowboy Dressage that can provide a blueprint for progressing toward the goal of a better relationship, anywhere and at the speed that suits both horse and rider.

Because Cowboy Dressage is open to all breeds and all levels of riders, there is no set frame for the overall look, head carriage or action. Each horse is assessed with reference to his type and confirmation. The goal of Cowboy Dressage is the harmonious, subtle, and relaxed flow between horse and rider.

Don't miss this opportunity to take advantage of the expertise provided for you and your horse. An experience you will cherish. Check the flyee in the Newsletter for information on this event.



Q & A with Larry by L. Henderson, ALRC/City Liaison Director

2023 is starting out as a busy year with inquires from several ALRC Members. If anyone has questions about activities in the community please do not hesitate to let me know and I will try and get you an answer.

Question1. What is the purpose of the recent survey stakes spotted in the area east of Skyline and north of Almond?

Answer: According to the City Engineer the survey is being done to determine the actual property lines location for the site conveyed to the Rancho Cucamonga Fire Protection District. The site would be roughly improved for Public Safety Agencies as a staging area during activities conducted in Cucamonga Canyon. The Staging Area may also be used as a Trail Head in the future.



Question 2. What is happening with the vacant property at the east end of Camellia Court?

Answer: Information provided by the City Planning Department indicates that an 8-lot custom tract was approved by the Planning Commission in September 1990. Under California State Law the recently purchased property will not require any City discretionary review if the new houses comply with the previous conditions of approval and the objective standards in City Municipal. In other words the houses can proceed through the City Departments without any further public review. Let's hope it will be compatible with the neighborhood.


