






Track your rides with Apps! _

Most of them are free (with premium upgrades or in app purchases available for additional cost). The apps are very user friendly. Simply start the session as you begin your ride and stop it when finished. The apps map the course, record some stats, and stores the rides for monthly recaps and totals. It is great to see the distances of the various trail rides in the area, as well as the other info tracted as you ride.
