THIS MONTH WE WILL RIDE AROUND LAKE PERRIS.

DESCRIPTION OF TRAIL RIDE:

Date: Saturday, November 18 Time: 8am-4pm

STAGING INFO: Meet at Heritage Park at 8am. It is about a 50 mile drive to our destination at Lake Perris. There is a \$10 entrance fee.

Plan to be in the saddle by 10. Bring snacks/lunch.

DISTANCE: 10 miles

TIME: approximately 4 hours

TERRAIN: Mostly flat single track dirt trails, one long dam to cross shared with pedestrians and cyclists, one optional short hill climb. Technicality: This is an easy ride as we circle the lake. There will be boaters and fishermen on the lake and a motorcycle track on the low side of the dam, but horses usually don't care or adjust quickly.

The Alta Loma Riding Club is hosting a Cinch Clinic taught by Robert Eversole (AKA TrailMeister)!

If you've ever thought about learning the craft of cinch making, join us to learn how to create a cinch for your own horse or create treasured handwoven gifts for friends and loved ones.

During this intensive class we'll go over the following as you build your first woven cinch: Cinch Materials — Natural vs. synthetic - Determining Cinch Size — How conformation affects cinch width and length - Knots to Know - Cordage Length - Building the Cinch - Details & Design work - After build care for your cinch - Resources for materials to make more cinches.

You'll also take home all the tools needed to create a cinch - Loom - Instruction Booklet - 5-piece tool kit!

As this is a basic cinch class we'll be focusing on straight cinches. You'll be able to use the techniques learned to create custom straight cinches, breast collars, belts, hat bands, key chains, and more. The skill used in making a straight cinch are prerequisites for more advanced builds such as roper and english style cinches.


Space is limited to only 16 people, so you'll want to reserve your seat ASAP.

The clinic costs \$350 per person, and a \$100 deposit per person is required to reserve your seat. You'll pay the remaining \$250 on the day of the clinic.


