Not a day goes by when someone visiting our tearoom notices the inconspicuous shelf behind our check out area and asks about the small shelf stuffed with mini teapots. Usually, it's to ask if they are for sale, which I proudly share that they are not, and how the collection came to be. To this day, it brings me such joy when someone inquiries about them because it allows me to tell their story.

For those of you who have known me for any length of time, you know that my first love these days is tea. It wasn't always that way. I never drank tea prior to deciding to open a tearoom. I know, for as much as I love it now, it may be a shocker to learn that it wasn't always a part of my life.

If you ask me what I love most about tea, it's hard to decide. I really love it all. I love the notion of having tea with a friend, the prettiness of it. I love the elegance of etiquette that ensues when we sit down around a pot. And I truly love the teapot.

Ah, the teapot, the bringer of joy, not just for what is inside of it, but for

even how it looks on the outside. While our shop has any number of styles and colors (I am especially fond of our line of teapots made in the U.S.A.), the options for teapots available around the world is really endless.

Now for the fun stuff, here's a few updates about our tearoom that we want you to know about.

Best of the Best – People's Choice by the Tampa Bay Times:

Thank you to all who voted for The White Heron in this year's Best of the Best, People's Choice poll by the Tampa Bay Times. I am so proud to announce that once again, The White Heron was awarded "Gold" for Best Tea Room in Tampa Bay.

This is the sixth year the poll has had a tearoom category, and the sixth time we have been awarded Gold. It is truly our honor to continue to serve you tea every day, and to be recognized for what we do. It's all because of you, and we thank you for trusting us when your friends and family come to visit, and for when you really just want that extra special experience.

Downtown Updates Near the Tearoom:

In an effort to create a more welcoming downtown district, the City of New Port Richey has started construction on Nebraska Avenue (known as Railroad Square), to the north side of the building that houses the tearoom. The road is closed, but you can still access our back parking lot through Missouri Avenue, just south of the tearoom.

Parking is limited in the back, and sometimes there are construction crews working there as well. The city is making every effort to limit our impact, and we appreciate your patience too.

Large parking lots are all around the tearoom, less than a block away. There is a public lot at Adams Street (behind the big brick building behind the tearoom) and on Bank Street (behind the Richey Suncoast Theatre). These lots are free to park in and are easily accessible for you to reach the tearoom.



For an even more fun experience on the weekends, plan to come a little early and park in the City's parking garage off of Main Street and US 19 and grab the DART shuttle to downtown. It stops at the corner of Nebraska and Grand (by the Richey Suncoast Theatre). From there, cross Grand Boulevard to our building. The DART will take you back to the parking garage after teatime (with a little tour around town too).

Price Increase for Afternoon Tea:

After much consideration, and taking into account all of our options, we will be increasing our pricing of our Afternoon Tea in the tearoom to \$26.95 (plus tax and gratuity), effective October 1, 2025.

This is not something we have taken lightly and have been discussing for nearly a year. With increases in food and operational costs, it has become necessary for us to make a slight price adjustment to our Afternoon Tea service. We have looked at many options to avoid this slight increase, looking at how we can adjust our tea service, but to be honest, I am not comfortable with sacrificing our service or quality. Our quality and care, and attention to detail is something we are known for, and something our guests appreciate and comment on most frequently.

Over the past 10 years, we have only adjusted our pricing 3 times. Each time, we wait until we can't wait anymore, as we really dislike having to make this decision.

We know times are tight everywhere, and we appreciate your understanding as we work to absorb some of the rising costs our small business has endured. We appreciate your understanding, encouragement, and continued support by coming and joining us for Afternoon Tea.

me being born and raised here in New Port Richey, I was instantly drawn to them. They were one of the first to buy prints I had made of some of my photography in 2003, when I worked for Great New Port Richey Main Street, and showed my art in their Progress Energy Art Gallery. Gosh, that seems like a lifetime ago.

Throughout my years, and all I did in the community, David and Midge were always so supportive. They were constantly encouraging me, sharing my story, and showing up to whatever I was doing in the community. So, it was no surprise that they would often come and enjoy tea in our tearoom once we opened. From the very beginning they would come for their birthdays and would even stop in just to say hi in their jaunts around town.

When Covid happened, and most of the world came to a halt, so did seeing our guests, and it became a very lonely time for us. Of course, we knew our guests and our friends were feeling that way too, so we started opening the gift shop on a limited basis. It took a while for people to feel safe enough to come see us, even with our protocols in place to do just that. As guests started to realize what we were doing, we started to see some stopping in to pick up tea.

It wasn't too long after we started our modified hours that David and Midge made their way into our shop. I remember sitting in the tearoom, enjoying a nice pot of tea, when my mom came in and said, "your friends are here to see you." I wasn't sure which friends but was pleasantly surprised when I rounded the corner and saw David and Midge standing in the middle of our gift shop. Midge was holding a small box, which she handed me. As I opened it, she said, "we are starting to downsize, and we thought you would just love this."

I slowly opened the decorative box, only to see a small, decorated metal teapot. I knew right away that this was a piece that I would put up for a collection, as it was too small and not made of the right material to use for drinking from. It was cute and as I stared at it, I found myself smiling for the first time in a long time (this time was very stressful for our business and the rest of the world).

I hugged and thanked them both for thinking of me. It was the first time I had hugged someone that wasn't my family in months. I could feel them both relax as we embraced. It was truly a heartfelt connection. After we separated, David joked, "whew, I'm so glad you like it because we have more." I told him it would be an honor to have them, and he vowed to bring me more in the future.

Thus, our tradition of David and Midge stopping by the tearoom every 1-2 weeks started. Each visit they would bring me a new teapot for my collection. They would tell me where they got it, we would visit, hug, and they would be on their way. Looking back, I wish I would have written down the stories they told me about each one.

As they brought in more teapots, I decided I wanted to display them in our shop for others to see, not just because they were cute, but because they remind me of two very special people in my life and of how tea can bring us together.

It turns out that my mom had a shelf that fit perfectly where I wanted to display them. She painted the shelf white and mounted it to the wall behind our cash register area so that our guests could see them too.

In total, they brought me ten mini teapots for my collection, and they started a trend. Since then, other friends have been out and about and found mini teapots to add to my collection. Every time I receive one, it melts my heart and reminds me about the two very special people that started my collection.

Today, I am nearly out of room on my small shelf, but the memories and the love that the mini teapots bring to me each time I see them is ever growing. I light up when someone asks about them because, while a majority of them were given to me by a very special couple, each one I receive means that someone saw it and thought of me. To me, even though I love my mini teapot collection, it's the thought that I crossed someone's mind that means the most.

Warm Apple Pie Cocktail

Recipe Inspiration: Apples are always popular during the cooler months. Ripe red apples are refreshing and delicious whether served as a whole fruit or in a warm apple pie. Therefore, we thought, what better ingredient to use in a delicious winter cocktail! If you enjoy apples and spices of cinnamon and nutmeg, this is the cocktail for you. Whether sitting in front of a warm fire reading a good book or by the campfire with friends, this delicious cocktail will have you relaxing and enjoying the winter months in no time.

This cocktail is best served warm with a cinnamon stick for garnish.

Food Pairing: This cocktail pairs lovely with spice cake with cream cheese icing.

Ingredients:

2 Apple Spice Black tea bags (Driftwood Tea Company or your favorite brand)

*If you prefer loose tea, use 1 tablespoon tea for 12 ounces of water (you want it slightly strong)

12 ounces of water, heated to 212 degrees F

2 ounces Spiced Rum

2 tsp sugar (optional)

*Garnish (optional)

Cinnamon Sugar (mix 2 tablespoons ground cinnamon and 2 tablespoons granulated sugar) 2 tablespoons water or simple syrup (we prefer Torani sugar cane, available at most grocers) 1 cinnamon stick

Directions:

Heat water to 212 degrees F.

Pour 12 ounces of hot water into a large mug or other tea steeping vessel, add 2 tea bags, and cover cup (you want to keep the tea as hot as possible).

*If using loose tea, put tea into mesh steeper, stepper basket, French press, or whichever other vessel you choose to steep in.

Steep tea for 5 minutes (be sure to set a timer).

While the tea is steeping, prepare your glass (see option below for cinnamon sugar rim)

*Optional - Sugar Rim: if you choose to rim you glass with cinnamon sugar, do that before adding spice rum to the glass. Take water or simple syrup and pour onto a folded napkin. Turn glass upside down and place rim on napkin, moistening the rim. Lift glass and place rim in cinnamon sugar to coat the rim. Lift glass and put right side up on counter. Continue with next step, filling glass.

Add 2 ounces spiced rum of your choosing to your drinking glass.

After 5 minutes, remove tea bags. Dispose of tea bags. Add tea to spiced rum, mix, garnish with cinnamon stick (optional) and enjoy.
