Happy Hot Tea Month!

As the weather gets cooler during the first part of the year, it seems only fitting that we would celebrate a beverage that makes us feel warm and fuzzy inside. Yes, I'm talking about tea...the second most consumed beverage world-wide (behind water). However, in the United States, tea ranks only in the top ten of beverages, and over 80% of tea consumed is iced.

Despite not being the number one preferred way to enjoy tea, hot tea, long thought to be time consuming to make and often not tasting the greatest (especially if using largely commercial brands), actually has a lot of benefits for your body.

For many people, simply holding a nice cup of hot tea and sipping it provides a type of relaxation that is rarely achieved today. With our busy lives, we rarely take time out to just be, and enjoying a nice hot cup of tea gives us that break, releasing stress, and warming us from the inside out.



In addition to the relaxation aspect, tea has many other benefits, including but not limited to helping control blood pressure and blood sugar, boosting immunity, increasing bone density, lowering cholesterol, decreasing overall body inflammation, and increasing memory. These benefits are derived from the actual Camellia Sinensis tea plant, and includes black tea, green tea, oolong, white tea, yellow tea, and dark tea (puerh). Herbals, not including the tea plant and often called tisanes, have different benefits.

The reason the Camellia Sinensis plant is so important is because it contains certain chemical compounds that help the cells in our body to respond positively to it, and to replace damaged cell parts with good to make our cells work property. Those chemicals include L-theanine (an amino acid that triggers relaxation and the "umami" feeling), and catechins (a natural antioxidant that helps prevents cell damage and prevents the formation of free radicals in the body, that ultimately protect our cells from being damaged).

Knowing all of the positive benefits that tea provides our bodies, I encourage you to take time each day during this new year to sip a nice warm cuppa or two and give your body the boost it needs to be the best that it can be.

Dear Friends and Tea Lovers

I can't believe the start of another year is upon us. Every year seems to pass faster and faster, and the one thing I wish for these days is for time to slow down.

It seems like only yesterday I was hosting our very first tea party in our twelve-seater tearoom, and here we are, nine years later, still serving tea in our original location in historic downtown New Port Richey, only now we over triple the seats.

Boy, how times have changed over the past nine years. From a sleepy little town where only a few people had faith that our tearoom would work (thank you Mario!) and too many storefront vacancies to count, to now being a part of a bustling community with not a storefront available, we have been honored to be a part of the renaissance of our hometown.

Looking back over the last nine years, it's humbling to see our transition, despite the challenges. And boy, have there been some challenges. Deciding to open a business in a struggling downtown district is a risk, one that I've watched so many other business owners take and fail. For those of you who know me, failure is never an option, and so I put everything I had into creating The White Heron. Of course, I knew there would be challenges along the way, but no one could have predicted a worldwide pandemic just as we were hitting our stride.

Did you know that it takes up to five years for businesses to really develop? The pandemic came as we hit our four-year mark, just as we were hitting our stride. Immediately, it was almost like we were starting over again. It has taken several years for the repercussions of the pandemic to lift to where guests were starting to return to us in pre-pandemic numbers.

Then, earlier this year (2024), with the rising costs of goods, everyone was impacted on what they could afford. The tearoom also felt those impacts as costs for us to do business rose across the board. It was a scary time for us, but with some out-of-the-box thinking by our team, we were able to make some adjustments to our tea offerings that have helped us keep our tea service price the same. It has always been important to me that our tea service remain at a level where guests can afford to come and enjoy tea in our beautiful tearoom. I really felt we did a good job of that this year, and then the unthinkable happened....

This Fall, our community was hit by not one, but two major hurricanes. While we managed to avoid a direct hit, the hit the community and our residents took was unprecedented. In late September, Hurricane Helene brought record flooding to our coast, impacting a large portion of our community, and many of our tearoom guests. While the tearoom was spared from physical damage, the business loss has been hard to overcome. Then, just three weeks later we faced more days closed due to another hurricane, Milton.

These two storms didn't just impact the tearoom, but the entire downtown area. From days closed due to the storms, to the lasting impact of a community destroyed, I can honestly say the future for the tearoom and many other businesses downtown is uncertain.

The White Heron has been a love of my life for the past nine years, and as we start this new year, I am anxious to look ahead to better times. Times filled with our community being able to return to their homes. Times where our downtown is a vibrant and thriving epicenter for families, residents, and visitors to shop, dine, and enjoy. Times when our tearoom is so full that you have to wait weeks to get a reservation (we were there in 2019). Times when we can all be together again.

We can't ask for anything from those impacted by this year's storms. They are already dealing with so much and they need to work on rebuilding their lives before they can come back to us. But, for those who weren't affected, who didn't suffer damage or lose parts of their homes, we need you. We have built a downtown community, a tearoom, a place for you to come. Now what we need is for you to come and share in all we have to offer. Come to the tearoom and have tea. Come shop in some of the cutest and most unique local shops around. Come walk the streets and stop into some of our fabulous restaurants. Bring your friends and family. Bring your visitors. Bring yourself. Just come.

We look forward to seeing you this year, not just for tea, but downtown too. Together we will keep our businesses thriving and our community strong, not just for today but for the future that is to come.

1. Tea used to be very expensive. It was kept in a locked tea chest in the parlor. The lady of the house was responsible for the tea and was often the only person with the key for the lock.

2. English tea gardens were the first public gathering place where women were allowed to mix with men publicly, without scandal or criticism.

3. In Ancient China, tea was a form of currency. Tea leaves were pressed into a brick. One side was scored so that it could easily be broken if change was needed.

4. There is a special name for when tea leaves uncurl as hot water is poured over them. It is called "the agony of the leaves."

5. Herbal teas are not actually teas because they do not contain leaves from the plant Camellia Sinensis. Instead, they are infusions made from the roots, leaves, flowers, seeds, and/or fruits of various plants and are often referred to as herbals or tisanes.
