"Healthy" Tea

What Does the New FDA Guidance Mean for Tea?

We love tea, not just because it's pretty and it tastes great, but because we know the tremendous health benefits that can be enjoyed simply by enjoying your favorite "cuppa."

Over centuries, cultures have adopted tea as a beverage of choice not just for enjoyment, but to help with various ailments and to keep their health in check.

What's most exciting is, depending on how a tea leaf is processed, into white, black, green, colong, or dark tea, they all offer different benefits. Benefits can range from keeping sugar and cholesterol in safe numbers to helping with heart health, to numerous benefits in between.

While we love to talk about all tea's benefits, we, under guise of the Food and Drug Administration, were never permitted to call tea "healthy." Parameters of what makes something healthy is left up to this governing agency, and they dictate what food products can be called "healthy.".

Imagine our excitement when we received word on December 2024, the FDA officially considered tea a "healthy" beverage and be labeled as such. In addition to allowing us to market tea as a beverage that is safe, it allows us to define the lines of what tea is and what it is not. This helps us in the tea industry to be able to effectively promote and share all of the great benefits of tea.



Below, we are happy to share what this new "healthy" designation means.

- Only teas that are derived from the Cameilla Sinensis plant can be labeled as "healthy." This includes black tea, green tea, white tea, yellow tea, oolong, and dark (puerh). This does not include any herbal teas.
- Tea (whether hot or iced) must be under 5 calories for a 12 oz serving. This means teas that has sugar, milk, and other additives are not considered healthy. You can prepare tea and add these, but it is discouraged as add items increase caloric intake.
- According to the Dietary Guidelines set forth by the FDA, beverages that are calorie-free, such as water, coffee, or tea without added sugar or cream, or that contribute beneficial nutrients, such as fat-free and low-fat milk and 100% juice, should be the primary beverages consumed.
- Tea is a caffeinated beverage and should still be consumed in moderation. The FDA recommends no more than two cups (or a maximum of 400mg of caffeine) consumption a day.

Dear Friends and Tea Lovers...

In a world where things in our lives change, sometimes by the hour or minute, we are committed to being here for you, and to providing you a continued escape into a beautiful and elegant tea experience. It's what we have enjoyed doing for all of you since we opened our tearoom in 2016, and as things continue to change, we look forward to being a constant in your lives.

I thought this would be a good time to let you know what we, at The White Heron, are doing today and what we have coming up on the horizon for the first part of this year.

Tea and Tariffs:

Many guests have asked us how tariffs are impacting our availability to get and keep tea for our guests. While much of the tea in the world is grown in China, most of the tea grown and processed there actually stays there. They continue to be the largest exporter of tea because of the volume of tea they produce, but there are several other countries that export a substantial amount of tea, including: Kenya, Sri Lanka, and India.

While our teas are sourced from growers all over the world, it's important to tell you that we do not import directly to our shop. We work with a larger importer who receives the tea and then passes it on to us.

Currently, our largest partner is located in Canada, which means much of our tea that is imported through Canda could potentially face increased tariffs. As of this writing, the tariff on tea has been paused, but this is something we watch daily. At this point, I do not anticipate having to raise our tea prices in the next month or two, but if the tariffs become permanent or shipping continues to increase, we may have to incrementally increase our tea prices. Rest assured, we will provide ample time and notice before we do anything. We appreciate your understanding and patience as we navigate this ever-changing landscape.

Tea Ware Made in the US:

Have you ever wished for an opportunity and then it fell in your lap? That's exactly how my next adventure happened.

As many of you know, Tennessee has been my home away from home since I was a child. I love spending time in the mountains, and because I've gone to the same area since I was eight years old, I have learned about unique places and people.

When I opened The White Heron nine years ago, I was travelling around the Artisan Loop just outside of Gatlinburg when I saw a ceramic company. It caught my eye because there were beautiful teapots in the windows. Of course they were closed, so I checked back, but they were never open. One day, while looking around, we saw someone by the building, so we asked about it. He gave us the owner's name and I looked her up. Oddly enough, during that same trip, we stopped at an English Pub and when I ordered tea, the teapot was made by the same lady. It was then that I made it my mission to find her. After countless searches, sending



letters and exhausting all of my resources, I realized that maybe it wasn't meant to be.

We visit Tennessee several times a year and after not travelling to the artist loop for nearly 8 years, this October, Bryan and I decided to take a drive there. As we rounded the corner to the ceramic shop there was an "Open" flag. I was so excited! Had I finally found my US Made Teapots? I was so happy to stop in and finally see these beauties for myself. Then, I noticed a "Going Out of Business" sign.

When I stepped into the shop, I was greeted by the nicest couple, Jane and David. They had purchased the company several years prior, but due to a slow business climate, they determined it was best to close. After a long conversation and checking out all the teapots and other tea ware, we decided to purchase a large amount of stock (I couldn't purchase as much as I wanted because we had driven our small Ford Fusion).

I bought as much as I could and told Jane that when she got ready to close, I would love to purchase more. She promised to keep me informed about their closing. We hugged each other and vowed to stay in touch, and I happily came hope to Florida with a car full of US made teapots.

Fast forward to October, when Jane called me to tell me that they were closing and asked if I wanted more teapots. She called two weeks after our salt room had been devastated by Hurricane Helene, and we were waiting for Hurricane Milton to arrive. I told her all this, to which she offered to pack everything up and hold it for me until I could get there. My heart was overjoyed because having these teapots was so important to me.

In mid-November Bryan and I drove back to Tennessee and picked up an entire truck full of US made products. We have been slowly unpacking them and putting them in our gift shop for you.

In addition to this being a mission of mine to bring these beautiful US made products to you, it also reiterates my commitment to being local when I can. With this source of tea ware, we do not have to worry about tariffs, and we've been able to keep the cost competitive to important tea ware. A win-win for all of us.

Just because Gatlinburg Ceramics has closed doesn't mean my mission to find and bring you US made tea ware is ending. I will continue to try to find the best US made products for you whenever I can. And if I can't find them, perhaps learning to make them will be in our future. That's a story for another time.
