

It's Time For Tea What Is White Tea?



It's summertime and that means much warmer weather that leaves all of us looking for ways to cool down. Hot tea consumption declines in the

summer, while iced tea consumption increases.

When it comes to teas consumed, there are a variety of types of tea to enjoy. Many (especially in the southern states) enjoy black tea, sweet or regular. Iced green tea has also seen an increase in consumption in the recent years, though it is rarely found on a restaurant menu. But what other refreshing options are available?

White tea has become a favorite of many of our tearoom guests over the past several years. At the White Heron, we love the delicateness and lightness of this delicious tea. It's very different than the traditional black and green teas and that's why we like it. Like black and green teas, white tea is absolutely delicious hot, but on those warm summer days having an iced glass of white tea is about as refreshing as one can get.

To learn more about white tea, we enlisted the help of Jason McDonald*, owner of The Great Mississippi Tea Company to explain what makes white tea unique and different than black and green tea. We hope you enjoy our question-and-answer session with Jason as we all learn more about white tea.

Tea Room Times: Can you tell us what white tea is? We know it's tea but what makes it unique?

Jason McDonald: White tea is the least processed of the tea types. Unlike black, green, and other types of teas that are made



from the Camellia Sinensis plant that require extensive and precise rolling and drying, white tea doesn't require any of that. There is a lot of mystery that surrounds

white tea because so many people aren't familiar with the type of tea. While it is plucked and 'that's it', there are so many factors that go into the tea. It is not just plucking tea and sitting it on the table to dry.

TRT: White tea is made from the same plant as black, green, and oolong teas. How is white tea processed differently than these other teas? **JM:** White tea does not have any rolling. All of the flavors must come from chemicals in the leaf from growing environment (i.e.- UV protection, sun protection, shade, etc.) or what is created in withering (i.e.- the breakdown of larger more complex chemical into smaller more delicious and aromatic chemicals).

Oppositely, black tea processing relies on the roll to break down the cells and create an oxidation which gives it, its main flavors. Green tea processing stops the chemistry before the oxidized flavors are created in the leaf.

The end result requires steps to get you there. In white tea, being able to use all of your senses and tea making skill is required because there is no external manipulation.

TRT: Is white tea easy to produce? **JM:** No, it is actually one of the hardest to produce. Again, some folks think they are producing white tea by plucking and sun drying. This is not the case. Think Silver Needles or Bai Mu Dan when you think of white tea.

It is reported that when making a batch of white tea, the tea factory manager is the one who actually processes this tea because it cannot be trusted to other folks to make correctly. It is probably a tea which requires the most skill and nuance than any other tea. It is not as easy as "pluck, that's it".

Avoeado Chiekpea Salad

Enjoy this refreshing "plant-based" treat this summer. This recipe is great for making a sandwich spread, a dip, or as a sandwich. At The White Heron, we use this delicious blend as a substitute for our chicken salad when we have vegetarian guests. It's flavorful, filling, fresh and perfect for the warm Florida summers.

Ingredients

- 1 large ripe avocado (pit and skin removed)
- 1 (15 ounce) can of chickpeas
- 2 tablespoons basil pesto (premade from grocery store works great)
- Juice from ½ lemon
- Salt and Pepper to taste
- Croissant (optional)
- Baby Spinach (optional)

Directions

- Open can of chickpeas, place chickpeas on a paper towel and roll and press them to loosen skins. Remove skins from all chickpeas. Put chickpeas in a plastic container and using a fork, crush and break up the chickpeas. You can break these up as much as you want so they blend well.
- Add avocado to the chickpeas and mix well.
- Add basil pesto, lemon, pinch of salt, and pepper, and mix well.
- Put in fridge to for 30 minutes or more to allow flavors to blend together.
- Cut croissant and put 3 leaves of baby spinach on bottom portion. Add avocado chickpea mixture to croissant.

Alternative: Use the Avocado Chickpea salad as a dip. Place in bowl and serve with pita chips, pretzels, or your favorite crackers.

Did You Know? **June is National Iced Tea Month**

Iced tea, according to statistics by the Tea Association of the U.S.A., Inc., accounts for 75-80% of all tea that is consumed nationwide. "This time of year, we see a large increase in the request for iced tea, in both our tearoom and in our tea-to-go services," states Kelly Hackman, Tea Sommelier and owner of The White Heron Tea & Gifts. "We still see a majority of hot tea drinkers for our traditional tea services in our tearoom, but there is no doubt that iced tea is a large part of what we serve overall, especially to go."

As history goes, iced tea started to appear in the United States around the 1860's. While mostly in the southern regions, mainly the Carolinas, iced tea became more wide-spread by the 1870's. It was around this time that recipes for making iced tea began to appear in cookbooks. In fact, two of the earliest cookbooks with iced tea recipes were the Buckeye Cookbook published in 1876 and written by Estelle Woods Wilcox, and Housekeeping in Old Virginia published in 1877 and written by Marion Cabell Tyree.

Despite these early publications, iced tea didn't gain in popularity until after the World's Fair in St. Louis in 1904. It was at this World's Fair that Richard Belchynden, a merchant and tea plantation owner, decided it would be better to sample his tea cool rather than hot, due to the hot weather at the fair. The tea sold so well at the World's Fair that it gained national popularity.
