E-Ray! From the Trenches

Corvettes of Carlisle is the premier all Corvette event of the year. Held this year between August 24-26 at the Carlisle Fairgrounds in Carlise Pennsylvania. This show is the perfect opportunity for Chevrolet to unveil in detail its newest Corvette models. For 2024, Corvette is releasing its newest addition to the C 8 family; The Corvette E-ray.

Most of us assume that E-ray is the beginning of the transition to all electric cars. Nothing could be further from the truth. We had an opportunity to view the new model up close with a factory demonstration car that was cut out to reveal the engineering features of this new Corvette.



We had the opportunity to ask questions to Executive Chief Engineer Tadge Jucchter, Vehicle Chief Engineer Josh Holder, and Chief Product Engineer Harlen Charles. All three were very forthcoming in explaining the car and its concept.

The original idea behind the mid-engine car began with Harlen Charles lobbying General Motors on the concept of Zora's car, a mid-engine supercar to supersede the already developed new C7 model.



This began in 2009. Yes, 2009! Five years before the C7 was to be unveiled. The concept was slow to take hold because both the C6 and new C7 were amazing cars and the buying public loved them.

When the concept was given the go-ahead in 2015, the team wanted to introduce a 4-wheel drive car, a first for Corvette. Engineers being engineers wrestled with different ideas to add a drive axel to the front of the C8 but space limitations were at a premium for a conventional transfer case and front differential. A hybrid assist assembly made the most sense. So, from the beginning the front axel and steering assembly were designed to accept an electric drive motor.

Those who own a C 8 can look at their cars front suspension shock tower and see it is bolted to the frame instead of being cast as part of the frame like the rear suspension. This design allowed an easy transformation of the front end to allow a drive system. The electric motor puts out 160 horsepower and is the size of a volleyball. Drive axels, steering and brake assemblies are all special to the E-Ray.

The mid-engine of the car is a Stingray with the standard 495 horsepower and 8 speed dual clutch transmission. An interesting note is that the front motor horsepower rating is 10 more than the 1953 Corvette!

The battery for the front engine is in the tunnel between the passenger and driver and is charged by the main engine. Space was made for the batteries but weight, the enemy of horsepower, has a prime consideration so the lithium ion batteries are for the front drive motor only and the electric motor can operate independently of the gas engine for only a few miles.

The main battery will also be lithium ion and located where the gel cell battery is presently located in all the other C 8's. Tadge spoke at length about this new Corvette and compared it with the 2023 Z06, which the E-Ray shares the wide body with. "The Z06 is a scalpel, while the e-Ray is a Swiss Army knife."

With performance numbers of 0-60 in 2.5 seconds, a quarter mile time of 10.5 seconds, and the ability to drive-in all-weather conditions, the new E-Ray will not only be the quickest Corvette ever, it also further stretches the envelope in performance that is uniquely Corvette.
