Each month when we meet, members come in with food or give a monetary donation...where we have a jar set up. Just \$1.00 is three

pounds of food for a family. We are very proud to announce that this year we collected \$1,647.31 for the food Bank and our sponsor will be donating a check from the match of the Ice Cream truck at the show which was around \$521.00. A GOOD DONATION BY ALL MEANS from our social Club.



OPERATION STAND DOWN: This non-profit takes care of some pretty special individuals here in Rhode Island. "OUR VETERANS".....This organization assists Veterans in getting back on their feet, with housing, medical, work, and self-esteem and so much more...you will have to look them up. Our Vice President educated the members of Operation Stand Down and we have welcomed this charity with open arms. This year the ladies running our 50/50 raffle raised \$3,070.00 leaving \$1,535.00 to be donated to Operation Stand Down from the club. I as President will be matching the lemonade truck that was at the show with sales of \$825.00...that's giving a total of \$2,360.00 to Operation Stand Down due to the generosity of members and Corvette enthusiasts from all over New England that attended our 48th Annual Corvettes by the Sea this past weekend.




Hall of Fame inductees for 2018 are John & Burt Greenwood, Tom Wallace, and Mike Yager. Individual seating and group tables are available.

Arne...yup that Arne brings two home runs to this issue.


