

Recipe of the Month

Ingredients

- 4 chicken breasts, boneless, skinless
- 1 cup roasted red bell peppers, sliced
- 1 cup tender fresh spinach
- 1 cup mozzarella cheese, shredded
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning blend

Salt and fresh ground black pepper, to taste

Directions

Preheat your oven to 375°F (190°C).



ROASTED RED PEPPER, SPINACH, AND MOZZARELLA STUFFED CHICKEN

- 1. Gently cut a deep pocket along the side of each chicken breast, being careful not to slice all the way through.
- 2. Stuff each chicken breast generously with roasted red peppers, spinach, and mozzarella.
- 3. If needed, secure the opening with toothpicks to keep the stuffing intact.
- 4. Combine olive oil, garlic powder, Italian seasoning, salt, and pepper in a small bowl. Brush this mixture evenly over both sides of each chicken breast.
- 5. Arrange the stuffed chicken in a baking dish and bake for 25–30 minutes, or until the chicken is thoroughly cooked and no longer pink in the center.



Celebrating the Early Roots of Corvette at 'The Glen'

On October 2, 1948, the small village of Watkins Glen, New York began a new chapter in the history of American motorsports.

The village hosted the inaugural Watkins Glen Grand Prix, the first major road race held in the United States after World War II. Daring men raced their machines around a 6.6-mile course, which combined the village streets and county roads winding through the woods south of Seneca Lake.

The Watkins Glen Grand Prix became an annual event, and in 1951 Harley J. Earl attended the race. Known today as the "Father of the Corvette," Earl was inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame's first class in 1998. As the head of General Motors Styling, he came to Watkins Glen to dis-



play his GM dream car, the Le Sabre. But what made the biggest impression on Earl was the thousands of fans cheering for all the European makes. He later credited this visit to "The Glen" as the inspiration for designing the Corvette, "America's Sports Car."

This September, the National Corvette Museum returned to these fabled streets for the Watkins Glen Vintage Weekend. This event celebrates the early days of racing through the village. Corvette was the featured marque for this year's festival, taking part in a special "Showcase of Speed" display of Corvette race cars.

Piloted by Brian Baker, National Corvette Museum Director of Education and Community Outreach, the Museum's Mobil 1 Corvette Stingray paced some of the most famous Corvette race cars in history. Baker led a rare opportunity to run several laps of the original street circuit in front of 20,000 cheering fans, retracing those early racing lines that made "The Glen" iconic.

Following the pace laps, Baker presented a session, "70 years of the Corvette in popular culture" on Saturday evening. The presentation included stories, themes, music, and advertisements from the Museum's latest exhibit, "An American Love Affair: 70 Years of Corvette." Hosted by the International Motor Racing Research Center, other discussion topics included the Solid-Axle Corvettes by noted author Alan Blay, who drove his 1953 C1 #76 From Merrick NY for the weekend.

The National Corvette Museum was honored to represent our members and the Corvette community at this historic gathering. Harley Earl's visit in 1951, and the birth of Corvette 70 years ago, are forever tied to the colorful history of auto racing in Watkins Glen.

"Wrong Number" Text Scams

If you've ever gotten a random "Hello" or "Hope you had a good day" text from a stranger, don't write it off as a mistake—it's likely the start of a scam.

These "wrong number" scams are exploding. According to McAfee (via CNBC), about **25% of Americans** have received them. The goal? Trick you into replying, build fake relationships, and eventually steal your money or personal info. "Pig Butcher," Unpaid Toll or Parking Fees are three very prevalent easy to fall for, and dangerous scams.

The FTC says \$470 million was lost to text scams in 2024 alone—a **fivefold jump** from 2020.



How It Works

- 1. You get a random message—simple, friendly, and vague.
- 2. **If you reply**, they know your number is real.
- 3. Then comes the long con: the scammer builds rapport (often romantic) and eventually tries to get you to invest or hand over savings. Even if you don't fall for it, any info you share can be used or sold.

Scammers now use **AI** to tailor these messages by location, harvest info from social media, and even lock down accounts for ransom.

What You Should Do

- **Don't respond.** Even a "Who is this?" confirms your number.
- **Don't try to figure out if it's someone you know.** If it's legit, they'll follow up another way.
- Watch for urgency or emotional triggers—hallmarks of scams.

How to Report or Block These Texts

- iPhone:
- Tap *Report Junk* at the bottom of the message
- Or swipe left > tap Trash icon > Delete and Report Junk (Note: You can't report it if you've replied—yet another reason not to.)
- Android (Google Messages):
- Tap and hold the conversation
- Select Block > Report spam > OK
- Or open the convo > More options > Details > Block & report spam > OK
- Forward spam texts to 7726 (it helps your carrier block them).

Scammers are getting more dangerously sophisticated with Ai. Stay one step ahead—don't take the bait.


